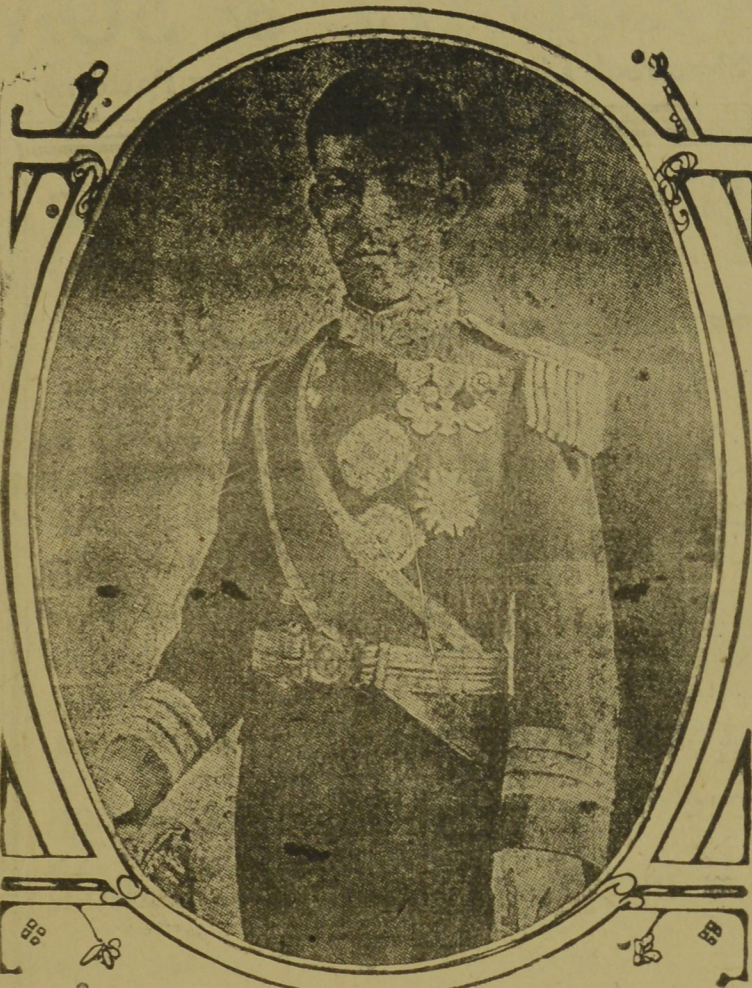

THE JAPANESE PARLIAMENT DISSOLVED BY EMPEROR



THE EMPEROR OF JAPAN

Tokio, Jan. 25.—The Emperor has dissolved the house of representatives. A political crisis developed at the opening of the diet on Tuesday. The chief reason was the appointment of Field Marshal Count Terauchi as Premier by the Emperor last October. This appointment was a surprise both in and out of Japan and was criticized unfavorably by Japanese political leaders, who contended that the Premier did not command public support. He is regarded as a representative of the radical militarist faction in Japan, although in an interview with the Associated Press shortly after his appointment he disavowed any policies of aggression.

Japanese newspapers said the Premier did not command a majority in the parliament and predicted that the outcome would be dissolution of the house and a new election.

Mining Company Wants Hungarian Chemist Admitted to Canada.

North Bay, Jan. 25.—The Dominion Government will be asked to allow a Hungarian chemist, a resident of the United States, to enter Canada as an employee of the Mattawan Mining Co., of Rutherglen.

The company claims that the Hungarian is the only chemist on the continent who has knowledge of the proper treating of the Rutherglen ore.

They are willing to deposit a bond of \$50,000 for his proper conduct, and the town council will make application.
