Cut the tender stalks with as much red as possible into two inch pieces. To each quart add three cubs of granulated sugar and the pulp, juice and grated outside rind of half a dozen oranges. Boil slowly and carefully until the mass is reduced to the stage where a little will jelly when dropped on ice.

Make It Into Pie.

The old stand-by rhubarb pie is de licious but the difficulty is to make it so that the juice does not soak the under-crust. Chop the rhubarb and use nearly as much sugar as rhubarb. juice so that there is less likelihood than usual of its soaking the crusts. "Garden Sass."

In a discussion of tuberculosis it was recommended that the council press for Dominion legislation dealing wtih the matter.


