SOME SEASONABLE RECIPES.

Savory Pie.

Peel and slice one pound or more of potatoes and chop two or three onions. Put a layer of potatoes in the bottom of a pie dish, sprinkle over them some of the chopped onion, a little parsley finely chopped and pepper and salt; on this put about half an ounce of butter in pieces; then put another layer of potatoes, etc., as before, until the dish is full; pour in about half a teacupful of milk and water. Make a crust with half pound of flour and four ounces of butter or lard and butter, add a sprinkling of salt and half a teaspoonful of baking powder; mix with cold water, roll out and cover the pie with it, bake in a moderate oven for about one and one-half to two hours; when once the crust is brown cover it with paper to prevent its becoming too dry or burnt.

Peach Pudding.

Mix two cupfuls of peaches with 2 cupfuls of fine bread crumbs, half a cupful chopped, blanched almonds, a half cupful of the water in which the peaches are cooked. Put in a buttered baking dish, cover with crumbs and bits of crackers and steam until sufficiently moist and hot.

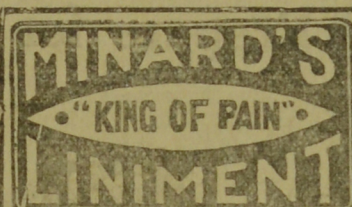
Braised Potatoes.

Cut a sufficient amount of potatoes with a ball cutter to measure 1 pint. Place in a saucepan with two table-spoonfuls of butter and two table-spoonfuls of flour.

Shake the pan constantly as the heat melts the butter, so that the potatoes may be thoroughly coated. Now add half a cupful of milk and a half cupful of water. Cook gently until the potatoes are tender. When ready to serve add 1 table-spoonful of finely chopped parsley and two table-spoonfuls of grated cheese. Shade well to mix.

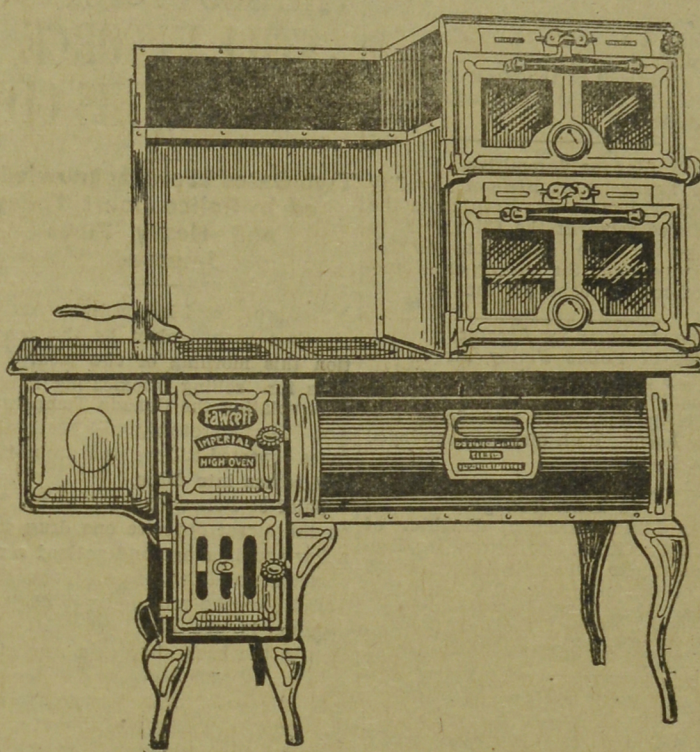

MILK FOR HENS BRINGS RESULTS

(Farm and Fireside.)

I know of several farmers who are getting good results from hens and chicks having no form of meat food except milk. On one farm an average of 200 hens have been kept for many years. These and the chicks raised each season consume the milk from two cows. The owner claims it is far more profitable than if the milk were fed to hogs. In many instances the milk is soured, warmed enough to separate and the whey poured off, using only the curd, thus eliminating a large per cent. of water.
