

## MR. VENIZELOS TELLS OF GRECIAN TROUBLES

Former Premier Gives Out Important Statement to Newspaper Correspondent.

Paris, March 14.—Former Premier Venizelos, of Greece, traces all the troubles of his country to the proposal of the Entente that eastern Macedonia should be ceded to Bulgaria, in the course of a long statement given to the Havas correspondent at Saloniki.

M. Venizelos reviews the events in Greece from the beginning of 1915 and explains and justifies his conduct.

"I am not exaggerating," he says, "when I say that without the Entente's proposal in regard to eastern Macedonia the king would never have dared to refuse to fulfil our treaty obligations towards Serbia."

The former premier further declared that he only raised the standard of revolt when it became evident that King Constantine would never join the Entente. He said that he refrained from giving the movement an anti-dynastic character because the Allies made that an express condition of the support and because the object he had in view was to carry out as far as possible the duties of Greece in respect to Serbia.

He concludes: "Our sole aim at present is to win the war. The outstanding grave internal question can be easily solved after victory and national unity will be re-established. In the impossible event of Germany being victorious, King Constantine would set up an unbridled autocracy, but if Germany, as I am certain it will, is finally vanquished, King Constantine, who stepped down from a constitutional throne to become a mere party leader, will have to submit to the consequences of the defeat of his policy just as any other party leader when beaten."

### LABOR EMIGRATION PROHIBITED.

London, March 14.—The Indian government has prohibited all labor emigration from India except to the extent necessary to supply the needs of Ceylon and Malay States. The order has been issued for the purpose of conserving India's man power for labor in connection with the war.

## WANT MILITIA ACT ENFORCED

Toronto, March 14.—In a manifesto just issued by the Orange order from the head offices here, they call on the government to not only enforce the militia act, but to prevent physically fit men from leaving Canada. In addition they want every fit Canadian who has gone to the United States since the outbreak of the war immediately sent back and enrolled for military service. Failing this, they would debar such from ever re-entering the country as undesirable citizens.

## DEPORTED BELGIAN WORK- MEN RETURN HOME

Germany Sends Back Truck Loads of Dying Men from Prison Camps—No Longer Serviceable.

Several carloads of deported Belgian workmen have been returned from German labor camps to Brussels.

These men, owing to the treatment they received in Germany, have been sent home to die. Even in Belgium nothing more pitiful was ever seen than the home-coming of these slaves, released because they were no longer serviceable, too weak to fetch and carry for their German masters. Many of them had to be lifted from the cattle trucks in which they arrived.

It appears that they were mobilized at Soltau Camp, Germany. They were huddled into cattle trucks, which were switched on to a freight train, destined to stop at every station en route to Brussels, and giving right-of-way to every other train on the line.

Ordinarily the journey takes six hours, but these sick men, travelling under conditions indescribably cruel were three nights and days in reaching their destination.

Periodically they were given a little bread and water, and one morning a decoction of boiled acorns. Some died every day, and two of the men became insane. They arrived at their homes emaciated and coughing, for most of them were dying of consumption.

Belgian citizens enslaved in German labor camps are beyond the help of Canadians; but for their mothers, and wives and children, we can do much. They are threatened by starvation more relentlessly today than ever.

## GIRL, HEAD CUT OFF IN PHOTOGRAPH, SUES

New York Model Objects to Use of Philadelphian's Face on Her Shoulders in Ad. Picture.

Philadelphia, March 14.—The courts are up against something entirely new. Is a pretty woman, whose head has been decapitated, photographically, to make way for the head of another beauty, entitled to \$50,000 damages, or any financial balm at all?

There is an inter-city interest involved in this instance, as the flowing hair, flashing eyes, pearly teeth and bewitching smile of Mrs. Blanche Buckius, of this city, were substituted for the charms of Mrs. Anna Yost, of New York.

Mrs. Buckius is an art model, and she registered no protest when her head was transferred to Mrs. Yost's shoulders—of course not actually, but for advertising purposes.

Mrs. Yost has asked the courts in New York to enjoin the photographic use of her body topped by Mrs. Buckius' head, pending the suit which she has brought for \$50,000.

The New York beauty has said nothing unkind of Mrs. Buckius' face, but it is perhaps not strange that she prefers to have her own head on her own body—even if it is only an advertisement of an aquaplane she is riding at Brighton Beach.

A camera company is responsible for the \$50,000 suit, because its substitution of one woman's face for another woman's face involves an inference that no woman can or will submit to.

Mrs. Yost was photographed on an aquaplane, which is nothing more than a contrivance of planks drawn through the water at high speed by a motor boat. She was well pleased with her tresses streaming in the wind, and with her coy pose, patterned somewhat after Diana of the Chae.

The business of the camera is to picture things as they are—at least that was the the original theory of its functions—and when it butted into the higher realm of the ideal by putting—it is only a suggestion, timidly put forth—a prettier head on shapelier shoulders, why of course Mrs. Yost burned with indignation and Mrs. Buckius has the matter under consideration.

## GERMAN AIRPLANE WAS SHOT DOWN

Amsterdam, via London, March 14.—A German airplane which flew over Sluis yesterday afternoon was shot at and hit by Dutch troops, who were manoeuvring in the neighborhood, according to the Handelsblad. The aviator was wounded and compelled to descend in Dutch territory, but then before he could be overtaken by Dutch soldiers, he re-started his machine and flew three hundred meters over the border into Belgium. German troops hurried to his rescue and he was carried away by Red Cross attendants.

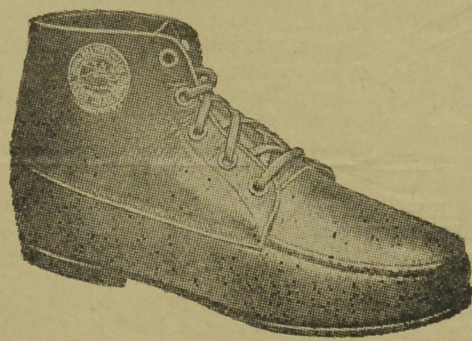

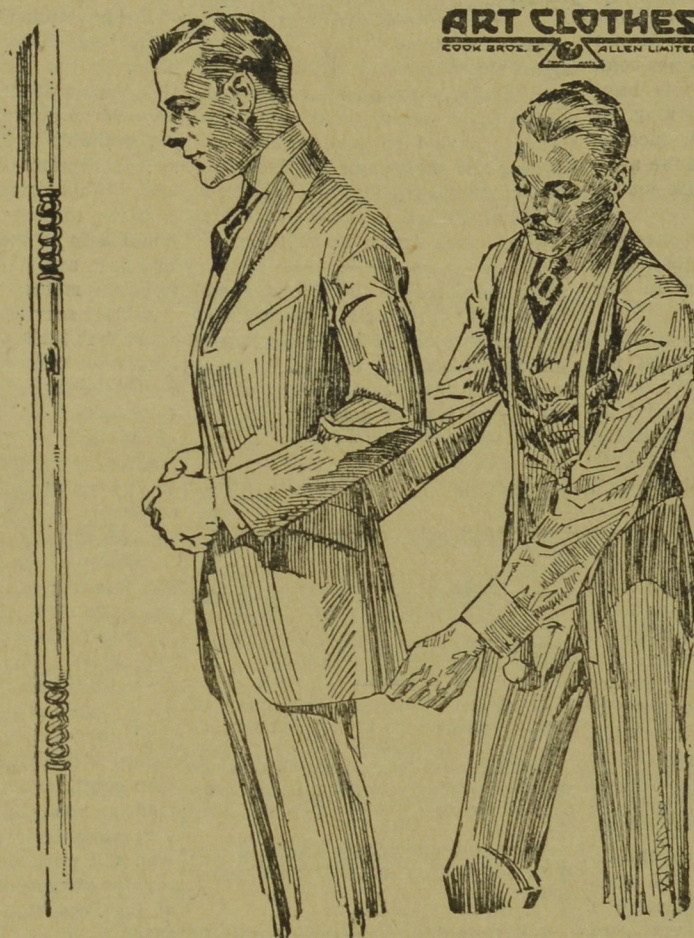
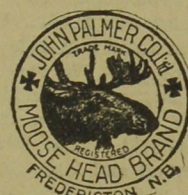
