Lester Dore drove a winner in the 2.11 pace with May Bird. Frank Fox made a hard try to get Andy Ashland home first, but the Medford horse broke in every mile just as he was in the stretch and leading.

### INDOOR SWIMMING RECORD NEARED

New York, Aug. 6. — Miss Charlotte Boyle of the National Women's Life-Saving League was the individual star at the opening meet of Splash Week, which provides a series of A.A.U. water carnivals under the supervision of the municipal authorities.

Competing in the Rutgers Street public bath she won both events for women, taking a 40-yard scratch, back stroke race in 39.35 seconds and then capturing a 50-yard free style swimming handicap in 32 seconds.

In the elimination heat of the latter contest, Miss Boyle covered 50 yards in 29.45 seconds, the fastest time ever made in this district by a woman, and within four-fifths of a second the American indoor record.



She swam 440 yards in a rough sea in 9m. 35s., and also won the 50-yard title in 33s. In the long event the little 14-year-old marvel had no competition after the 220-yard mark. The water was so rough that the officials were inclined to postpone the events, but carried out the programme at the request of the competitors.
