

## HELPFUL HINTS.

To remove paint from glass or any similar surface, use strong ammonia which can be purchased at any drug store. It will save time and patience.

If you want to keep fine linens or laces perfectly white, take a pillowcase and blue it thoroughly, then wrap your linens in it. They will keep white for an indefinite length of time.

When hanging clothes on the line on a windy day, try putting fine handkerchiefs, collars, etc., into a pillowcase and hang the case by the top. They will dry quite well and it will save a good deal of wear on them.

A good way to keep pillows clean is to take a slip of white cotton and pull over them. It can be stitched at the end and when dirty it can be easily taken off, washed and replaced. This does away with the troublesome handling of feathers.

If you need ink in a hurry and find your ink bottle empty, try using washing blue. It makes an effective substitute.

If anybody in your home finds difficulty in threading needles, have some member of the family thread several needles onto the spool of thread to be used. Then, by slipping the others along the needles may be used one by one until all are used.

Having no angel cake tin, I took a round pan about the size of the regular angel cake pan and about three

inches high, lined with waxed paper, setting an inverted tumbler (the small peanut butter tumbler) in the centre, then put cake in as usual. As good nearly as the real tin.

In baking beans try using a tablespoonful of lard instead of half pound of pork. Beans are just as good and not nearly as expensive, and no waste.

When white silk waists have turned yellow, wash in lukewarm water and soap with a little ammonia. Iron on wrong side.

To clean copper, make paste with vinegar, salt and a little flour, rub all over, rinse in hot water and dry good. Looks like new.

To make ferns and palms grow, give them one teaspoonful of castor oil once in three months. You will be surprised to see the difference.

suet, 1 teaspoon cloves, 1 teaspoon of cinnamon, 1 package raisins. Mix all together and boil 5 minutes. Let cool, then add 1 teaspoon soda, dissolved in a little cold water. Bake 45 minutes. This makes two small loaves.

## CASSEROLE ONIONS.

Peel amount of onions required for dinner and place in a casserole dish with a cover and add butter size of an egg. Place in oven and cook until tender. Cooking them this way is a great improvement in flavor. They taste good.

## FRIED TOMATOES.

Do not pare tomatoes, but cut in slices, dip in cracker pounded and sifted, and fry in butter.

## USEFUL HOUSEHOLD INFORMATION.

A table of information which the housewife needs to be constantly reminded of is as follows:  
4 quarts make a gallon.  
8 quarts make a peck.  
4 tablespoonfuls of liquid make one teaspoonful.  
4 teaspoonfuls of liquid make one tablespoonful.  
4 tablespoonfuls of liquid make a quarter of a cup.  
3 teaspoonfuls of dry material make a tablespoonful.  
16 level teaspoonfuls of dry material make a cupful.  
8 heaping tablespoonfuls of dry material make a cupful.  
2 cups or 4 gills make a pint.  
4 cups of liquid make a pound.  
4 cups of flour make a pound or quart.  
2 cups of solid butter make a pound.  
Butter the size of an egg equals 2 ounces or a quarter cupful. One heaping tablespoonful the same.  
2 cups of granulated sugar make a lb.  
Two and a half cups of powdered sugar make a pound.  
Three cups of meal make a pound.  
1 pint of milk or water equals a pound.  
16 ounces make a pound.
