## CUBA WILL FOLLOW THE LEAD OF THE UNITED STATES

Havana, April 6.—The following resolution will be presented to the joint committee tomorrow afternoon by representative Alfredo Betancourt Manduley, for consideration: "The Congress of the republic of Cuba declares that there has been created and exists a state of war between the United States and the Imperial German government, and authorizes the chief executive of the nation to adopt all measures necessary to maintain and defend Cuban territory, provide for the security of its inhabitants, and co-operate with the United States of America and the other allied nations lending every assistance for the defence of the liberty of the seas, of the rights of neutrals and of international justice."

Representative Jose Estrampes will present at the next session of the House a resolution authorizing the President to organize and place at the disposition of the War Department of the United States a contingent of 10,000 men to assist in the military operations of that country in the European conflict. Representative Estrampes, who was a colonel in the Cuban army of liberation, will offer his services in connection with the proposed Cuban contingent.

## BRITISH TROOPS TOAST UNCLE SAM

British Army Headquarters, April 7.—The British army as a whole has regarded the United States as practically in the war since the severance of diplomatic relations. It was said then that active participation was only a matter of time.

The President's address was just reaching the front trenches today in its entirety. The gist of the speech had been sent out by wireless and also by telegraph and telephone, but the soldiers generally preferred to wait for Congressional action before speaking to "Fritz."

The weight of America thrown into the war scales just at this juncture, in what is regarded as the critical year of the struggle, has sent a renewed thrill of confidence all along the front.

Toasts were drunk to America at many a front line dugout tonight. The British look forward eagerly to the participation of the United States, thus helping to completely outlaw German militarism.

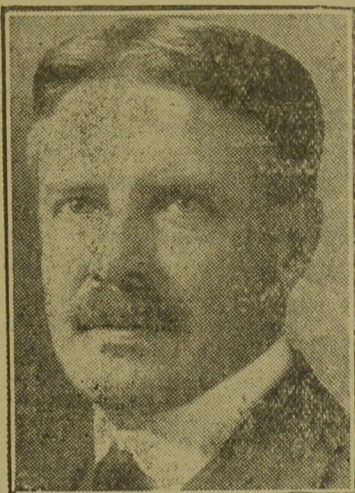
## GERMAN / AMERICAN PLAGED UNDER ARREST

Toledo, Ohio, April 7.—Charged with threatening the life of President Wilson, Julius Rohrbach, a German farmer residing at Napoleon, near here, was arrested last night by a government secret service official. According to the officer, Rohrbach called the President a vile name, said he should be shot and he was making preparations to take a train for Washington.

Rohrbach's arrest was ordered from Washington, a patriotic citizen representing the alleged remark to the government there.

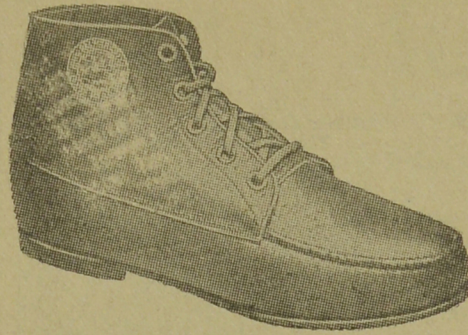
## CONGRATULATIONS FOR WILSON.

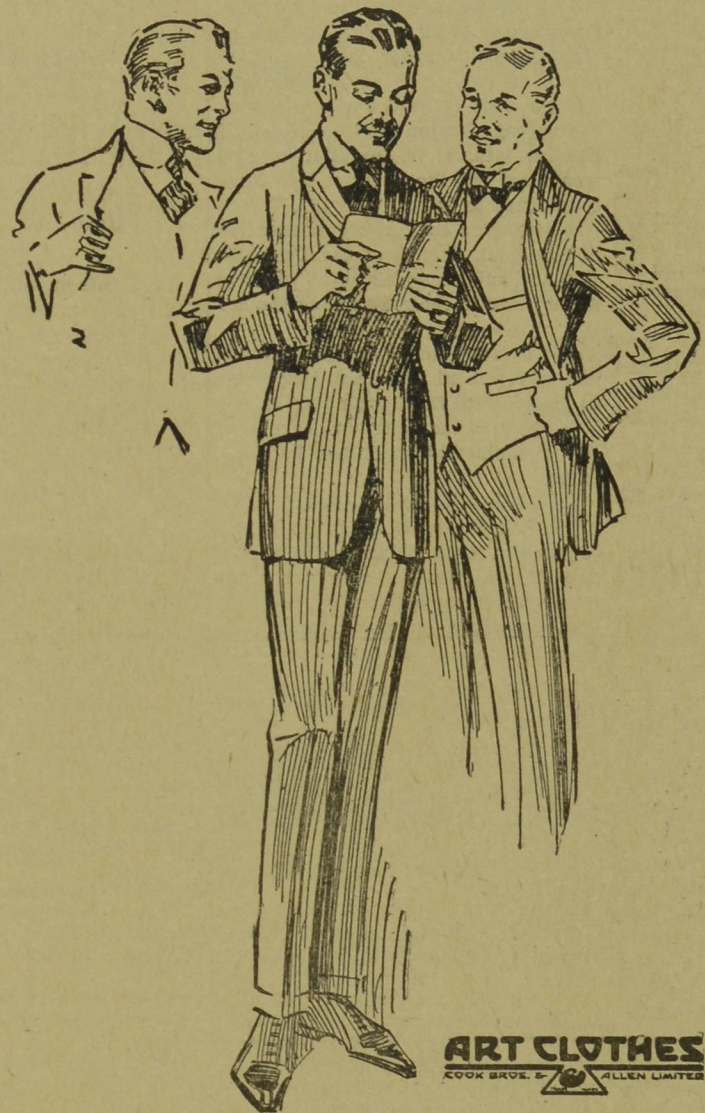
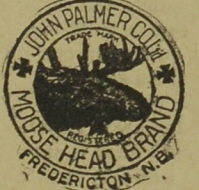
