Havana, April 6.-The following re solution will be presented to the joint committee tomorrow afternoon by re presentative Alfredo Betancourt Manduley, for consideration: "The Congress of the republic of Cuba declare that there has been created and exists a state of war between the United States and the Imperial German gov ernment, and authorizes the chief exe cutive of the nation to adopt all measures necessary to maintain and defend Cuban territory, provide for the security of its inhabitants, and co-oper ate with the United States of America and the other allied nations lending every assistance for the defence of the liberty of the seas, of the rights of neutrals and of international jus-

Toasts were drunk to America at many a front line dugout tonight. The British look forward eagerly to the participation of the United States, thus helping to completely outlaw German


GERMAN AMERICAN PLAGED UNDER ARREST
