LOOKING AFTER SEED FOR 1918

The Provincial Committee on Greater Production Now Making Plans for Next Year.

The Provincial Production Committee met in the office of the Secretary for Agriculture on Tuesday, October 23rd, with the chairman, E. A. Schofield, presiding.

It was decided to entertain distribution of grain next spring and the secretary for agriculture was instructed to ascertain prices on the following minimum quantities: Wheat, 3,000 bushels; buckwheat, 1,000 bushels; barley, 1,000 bushels, and oats, 15,000 bushels.

The prospective scarcity of fertilizers was discussed at some length and quotations submitted by several firms were considered.

Home mixed fertilizers were favored, but upon the advice of one of the members, who has had extensive experience in this work, it was decided to allow the purchasing of chemicals to stand over for a time. One quota-

WHAT WILL HAPPEN AFTER NOVEMBER 10?

Montreal, Nov. 2. — What is going to happen after November 10? is a matter which is seriously concerning the military authorities and public men in this province. With only a week for registration left, there remain some 70,000 men who have not registered, while in the many weeks in which registration has been open to them only 9,000 have gone before the examining boards. It looks very much like an organized effort to evade military service through passive resistance, and in a very large measure the government itself is responsible for this state of affairs.

A year ago when an appeal was sent out for men to sign the National Service cards the young French-Canadians of the province simply ignored the cards sent them. Threats of a more or less mild nature were published in the papers to the effect that those who did not register were liable to be punished, but this did not affect the situation in the least. The men who did not sign never heard any

tion was for 1,500 tons of a 3-6-5 mixture delivered at any station in New Brunswick in carload lots; fertilizer to be in 100 lb bags as in barrels, the latter at a slight increase over the former. The potash is guaranteed water soluble. The department is now taking necessary steps to ascertain the value of the guarantee and also to learn more about the source.

This committee, co-operating with the department of agriculture wishes it made clear that this movement is strictly a war measure and is not for the purpose of interfering unduly with any existing business.

The fertilizer is now available, if an agreement can be made, and to ensure this supply of potash fertilizers is the motive.

Last spring the demand for fertilizers was greater than the supply and the prospects are that a similar condition, only more so, will exist next spring. If a demand for chemicals other than potash is manifested, no doubt the department will seriously consider handling any that may be secured.

The above supply of 3-6-5 fertilizer or any secured subsequently, will be sold on a cash basis or upon a bank settlement, where the purchasers arrange the necessary credit with their local bank. Delivery will be made upon advice of the bank manager. Nothing less than carload lots will be sent to any point. All agricultural societies will be circularized immediately and they may order through their secretary and make the necessary arrangements at their local banks as organized bodies.

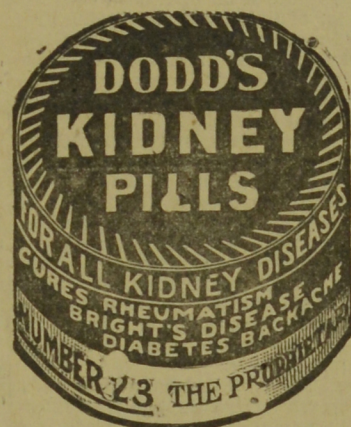

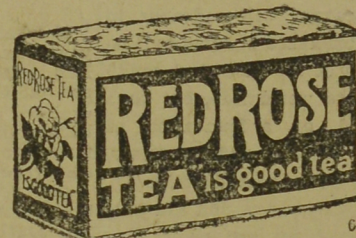

The Military Service Act, 1917



DON'T DELAY ! Do It TODAY

THE MILITARY SERVICE ACT is passed; the Proclamation issued October 13th. It is now the bounden duty of every man in Class One to report for service or claim exemption. This includes all bachelors and widowers without children (not otherwise excepted) who were 20 years old on the 13th October, 1917, and whose 34th birthday did not occur before January 1st, 1917.

What To Do

Go to your Post Office and ask for the form for reporting for service or for claiming exemption. The form contains clear instructions for filling in. Do this not later than NOVEMBER 10th.
