Of the new players that the Tigers are carrying, Emhke is easily the gem. This youth would be performing for the Griffins now but for the advent of the Federal league. The Old Fox had him planted on the coast in 1914 and he made a fine record. When Griffin tried to yank him to Washington the Buffalo Federal league club induced him to flop and he played there throughout 1915.

Overwork in that circuit set him back and when peace was declared he was shunted to the Syracuse club of the New York State league, from where the Tigers got him last autumn. His first defeat with the Tigers last year was received when he faced the Red Sox. Emhke is said to be a real star. He has a side arm motion and other interesting things and his smoothness makes his work enjoyable.

M'GRAW AND UMPIRE BYRON HAVE A SCRAP

Lively Time in Cincinnati—
Byron Had Ordered Mc-
Graw Off Field—Play-
er's Statement.

Cincinnati, June 9. — After the New York Cincinnati game had been finished yesterday, Manager McGraw of the New Yorks and Umpire Byron of the National league were the participants in a fight at the ball park. In a signed statement McGraw admits he hit the umpire but claimed he was provoked. McGraw said:

"I met Byron near the umpires' dressing room after the game. I had been ordered from the field during the game. Byron said to me: 'McGraw, you were run out of Baltimore.' I answered: 'Do you say that I was run out of Baltimore?'"

HOMAGE PAID TO DARCY'S MEMORY

To show the general feeling of respect for Les Darcy, a touching scene was enacted at the Lewis-O'Dowd bout in New York the other night. Just before the main bout Joe Humphries asked the large crowd to stand up in silence and pay homage to the memory of Darcy. The house was deathly quiet and with bared heads listened attentively as Humphries said:

"I voice your and my own sentiments when I ask from the centre of this ring here tonight that God be good to the memory of that pugilistic martyr, Les Darcy, who died today without ever really having a chance."

Billy Roche, the veteran referee, says: "Darcy, undoubtedly one of the greatest fighters the world has ever known, was hounded to death. Darcy was a victim of circumstances, and of a man who seeks publicity. The crusade against him in the United States was eminently unfair, and the boy worried over it until his health gave way under the strain. It was the campaign, not pneumonia, which killed him."

LEONARD, JEW NAMED LEINER

A New York paper says: Benny Leonard is the first man to win the title in a bout scheduled for only ten rounds. He won his crown by a clean knockout, and his right to it is better established than was the championship won by Welsh from Ritchie on points or Ritchie's title taken from Ad. Wolgast on a foul.

Leonard also is the first champion that New York city can boast of. He is a Hebrew, well educated, gentlemanly and young for a titleholder, only 21 years old. His right name is Benjamin Leiner.

DUNDEE DRAWS WITH WELLING

New York, June 8. — Johnny Dundee and Joe Welling fought a great 10-round draw at the St. Nicholas rink last night. Welling landed the cleaner punches and might have earned a verdict had he been a little more aggressive. Dundee's wildness evened up the score.

As early as the second round Joe had Dundee on the verge of a knockout, but too late in the round to do any real damage. When the punch landed Dundee almost collapsed. Welling said after the bout that he injured his right hand in the seventh round.

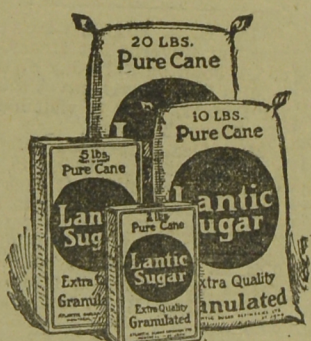
MARMALADE without weighing

Slice six bitter oranges and seven sweet oranges and add three cups of cold water for each cup of the fruit pulp. Let stand for 24 hours in a glass or porcelain vessel, then bring slightly to the boiling point and boil for 15 minutes. Set aside for another 24 hours. Then measure five kitchen cups full of the fruit into a preserving kettle and boil briskly for about an hour. Add a 2-lb. carton of Lantic Sugar, which will need no weighing as it has been accurately weighed when it was packed.

Note: This quantity makes nearly 5 pounds of marmalade. It is better not to cook more than this at one time as the long cooking tends to darken it.
