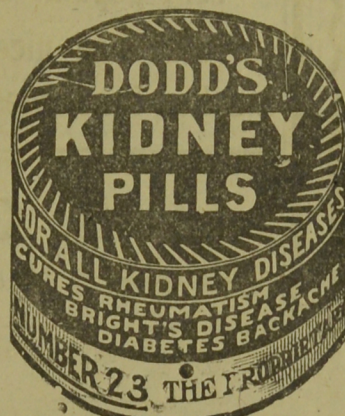

HIGHEST PRICED BULL IN
WORLD GOES TO BROCKTOND. W. Field Pays \$53,200 for King Ormsby Jane
Rag Apple, Five Months Old, at Worcester Auc-
tion of Holstein-Friesian Association--\$18,000 also
Paid for Young Cow, Glen Allen DeKol--Auction
Made Record for Cattle Sales.Worcester, June 7. — The highest
price ever paid in the world for a Hol-
stein bull at public auction was passed
over tonight in Worcester when D. W.
Field of Brockton wrote a check for
\$53,200 for a five-months-old bull calf
which he bid off at the auction of the
Holstein-Friesian Association held here
today in connection with the annual
convention.The animal, which was born in Janu-
ary, is known as King Ormsby Jane
Rag Apple, and was consigned to the
sale by Oliver Cabana of Elma Centre,
N. Y., proprietor of Pine Grove Farm.The little fellow, which weighs not
more than 500 pounds, now has the dis-
tinction of being the most valuable
Holstein bull in the United States or
Canada, if not in the world.Up to today the most valuable Hol-
stein bull in America was King Segis,
owned by F. F. Field of Brockton, a
brother of the purchaser of King Orms-
by Jane Rag Apple.Up to within a short time, D. W. and
F. F. Field, who are shoe manufactur-
ers under the firm name of Field Bros.,
were in partnership in the Holstein
breeding business.When the little bull calf was led into
the auction ring the bidding started at
\$15,000 and continued brisk for several
minutes. Six bidders went over the
\$40,000 mark and James F. Shanahan
of Buffalo stuck with Mr. Field up to
\$53,200.Never before have there been such
scenes at a Holstein-Friesian auctionas attended to day's sale. The auction
was held in the automobile building at
the New England fair grounds and it
was conservatively estimated that
more than 2,000 were present when the
record sale was made.Sixty-one head of Holstein cattle
were sold during the sale, which con-
tinued until 9 tonight, and they brought
a total of \$144,061.The next in price to the young bull
was a cow, which sold for \$18,000. She
is Glen Allen De Kol. She was bought
