The fear of alien enemies in the United States has caused some inconvenience to a former Fredericton man in Biddeford, Me., judging from a query received by Chief of Police Finley from the Committee of Public Safety of Biddeford, Me. Mr. Fred A. Robenian's statement to Mr. Tarbox was that he had been born in Constantinople but had fled as a refugee in a French ship at the time of the Armenian massacres in Turkey twenty years ago, also that he had lived in France for a time and had gone to school there. Conserning his residence in Fredericton he stated that he had gone to school here and gave the name of the lady in whose department he of the lady in whose department he

Ground Taken.

His Honor in his judgment took the ground that the primary and really the only object of the Intoxicating Liquor Act of 1916 was the suppression of the traffic in intoxicating liquor in New Brunswick and that it is the duty of the judge to make such construction of the statute as shall, if possible, suppress the mischief aimed at and advance the remedy. Even where the usual meaning of the language falls short of the whole object of the Legis lature a more extended meaning may be attributed to it.
