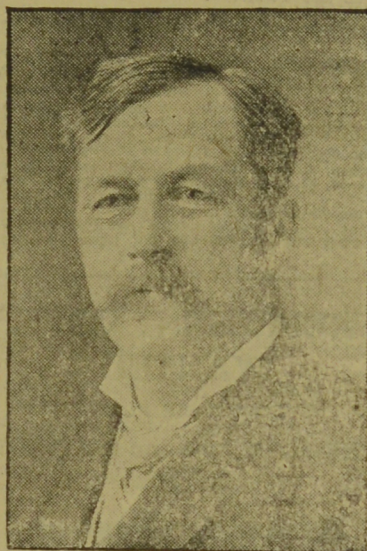

He was defeated in 1912, but in the election of Feb. 24th was returned by an enormous majority, his opponents losing their deposits.

Minister of Agriculture.

Hon. J. Fletcher Tweeddale is one of the prominent farmers of Victoria county, and is well fitted to accept the post of Minister of Agriculture. He too has had much experience in legislative and municipal work, having been in the Legislative Assembly for a considerable period before 1912. He is a man who has always led an active life and has that energetic method that spells success. He can be depended upon to give careful and conscientious attention to the affairs of his department that is so important to the great majority of the people of New Brunswick.

Hon. C. W. Robinson.

Hon. C. W. Robinson has for nearly a score of years been a commanding figure in the best political life of New Brunswick. Had his personal interests been less absorbing or demanded less of his attention, he would have been leader of his party today, but at the provincial convention in 1916 the Hon. Mr. Robinson, with that straightforwardness which always characterizes him, felt that he was not giving the time and attention to opposition party affairs that they demanded, and he insisted that a new man be selected for the position.



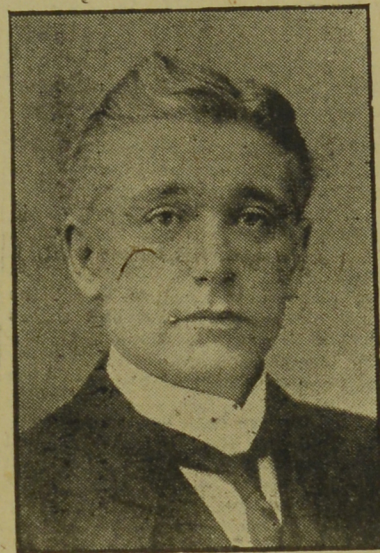

Premier Foster is fortunate in having Mr. Robinson a member of his government, even without portfolio. It is an open secret that had Mr. Robinson desired a more important position in the government he could have had it, but he has always felt that a public man should not permit his private business to interfere with his attention to the public interests and the ministership without portfolio will not

make such insistent demands upon his attention.

Hon. L. A. Dugal.

Hon. L. A. Dugal, the hero and the idol of the people of Madawaska, and it may well be said of the Acadians of New Brunswick, is one of the most modest gentlemen who ever sat in the Legislature. Where he lives he has always been honored so far as it was possible for the people of Edmundston, his native town, and of Madawaska, his county, to honor a man. Mr. Dugal's reputation in New Brunswick for sturdy honesty and for unflinching courage became known in the spring of 1914, when he stood in his place in the House and preferred charges against the then Premier of the province, J. K. Flemming, the investigation into which resulted in the end in the downfall of the Premier, and still later in the downfall of those associates of his in the government and in the Legislature who stood behind those transactions which the electors of New Brunswick condemned.

Mr. Dugal and his associate, Mr. Pelletier, stood two to forty-six against what they considered to be fraud and corruption in public life, and their stand then has been endorsed by the people and there should be no prouder man in New Brunswick today than this new Acadian minister who goes into Premier Foster's government without portfolio.

Hon. Dr. Roberts.

Hon. Dr. W. F. Roberts, of St. John, the remaining fore-castle member, is one of the popular men who succeeded in overcoming government influence in the city of St. John. He is a physician who is well known and who has taken a great interest in the affairs of his own town, and particularly with regard to the questions of public health and will bring to the government a knowledge and experience in those particulars that should be very valuable.

WAS TORPEDOED WITHOUT WARNING

Twenty-Four Members of the Crew of the Trevoise Are Unaccounted For.

New York, April 3.—The Associated Press says: The British freight steamship Trevoise, recently reported by the German admiralty as having been sunk was torpedoed without warning on the 18th of March and twenty-four members of her crew are unaccounted for, according to officers of the Fabre Line steamship Venezia, which arrived here today with five of the Trevoise's crew. The Venezia brought also nineteen men from the British passenger steamer Alnwick Castle, already reported as having been sunk without warning on March 19. The five from the Trevoise were rescued by the Alnwick Castle from an open boat.

The twenty-four men brought in by the Venezia had floated for four days and nights before being picked up. They said that five of their number died from exposure during that time.

Many of those rescued are still suffering from frostbite and frozen limbs. The Alnwick Castle, they said, carried a crew of 100 men and 24 passengers. The British Admiralty had already reported that ten of the persons she carried died and more were missing.

Seven boats were launched from the Alnwick Castle, but owing to the gale blowing they were soon separated and

Coal Conference Ended at Ottawa

Ottawa, April 3.—Sir George Foster has concluded his conference with the Nova Scotia coal operations. The question of supplying coal for Eastern Canada was thoroughly discussed. The chief difficulty is an adequate supply of labor to maintain the coal output at normal degree. It is hoped that from the conference the operators will be able to furnish the required quantity of steam coal.

ST. LAWRENCE NAVIGATION.

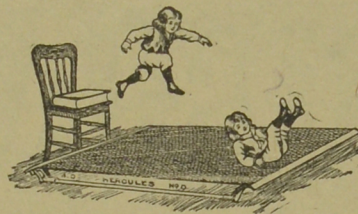

The survivors of the Trevoise said that vessel was sunk early in the morning of the 18th, the U-boat not being sighted by anyone on board, and no warning being given. The crew took to the boats, which soon drifted apart. The survivors picked up by the Alnwick Castle had been on that ship only a few hours when she was in turn torpedoed.

The Trevoise was on her way from Newcastle, Eng., to Alexandria, Egypt. The Alnwick Castle was on a voyage from London to Capetown, South Africa.
