

A GREAT MANY CHANGES IN THE ELECTORAL MAP

The New House Will Consist of 235 Members Against 221 in the Late One --Many Eastern Constituencies Lose Their Identity--Changes in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia--West gets nearly a Score of New Members.

Ottawa, Nov. 28. — Nominations for the general election occurring on Monday, were the first official application of the Redistribution Act which, passed in 1912, became operative only when the late parliament was dissolved. There are many changes in the electoral map, and candidates who lined up Monday will in numerous instances face entirely new constituencies. In the east several ridings lost their identity by being joined with others, while in the west, because of the increased population since the

last census, new divisions have been carved out of old ones.

The membership of the house has been increased from 221 to 235.

For Monday's nominations and the subsequent election proceedings, two hundred and thirty returning officers had been appointed. The counties of Halifax, St. John city with the counties of St. John and Albert, Queens, P. E. I., South Cape Breton and Richmond and Ottawa each elect two members jointly. Elsewhere, each riding will have one representative. Nominations were to be held between twelve noon and two o'clock, and one may have been nominated who was a male British subject of age and not disqualified because of corrupt practices, or because of being a government contractor, government employee or member of the legislature. There was no real qualification but a \$200 deposit was required.

Changes now becoming effective on the basis of electoral representation are reflected in every province. In the east, there are new constituencies and those which are wiped out

In the west, none has disappeared but there are many new ones.

In Ontario, Brockville goes out as a separate seat and goes on to Leeds. The constituency will be known as Leeds. North Grey stands, but South and East Grey are merged into one; West Huron goes out and is divided between North and South Huron. Where are used to be two Kents, there is now but one; the same with Lanark, while Middlesex goes on to West Middlesex and the two North-landers become one.

New constituencies in Ontario are Parkdale in Toronto; four instead of three seats in the Yorks; Fort Wil-

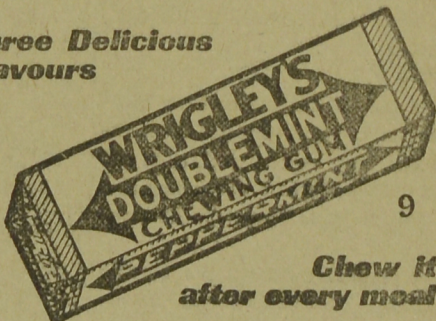
