Montreal, Nov. 29. - The police to

day began to draw in the drag net the drag n which has been thown out in the Montreal district for men who have failed to perform their duties under the Military Service Act.

"We are on the warpatth," said Deputy Chief of Police Grandchamps this morning. "I have given instrucions to every officer on the force to round up those who are liable to military service or who may be presumed to be liable to serve."

Eugene Godin, the local registrar under the Military Service Act, has supplied the police with a large number of names of men who have failed to come forward

The men will be arrested on sight and taken to the police station, where they will be treated as deserters.

Incidentally the police hope to clean up certain districts of the city where men, living on vice, congregate.


