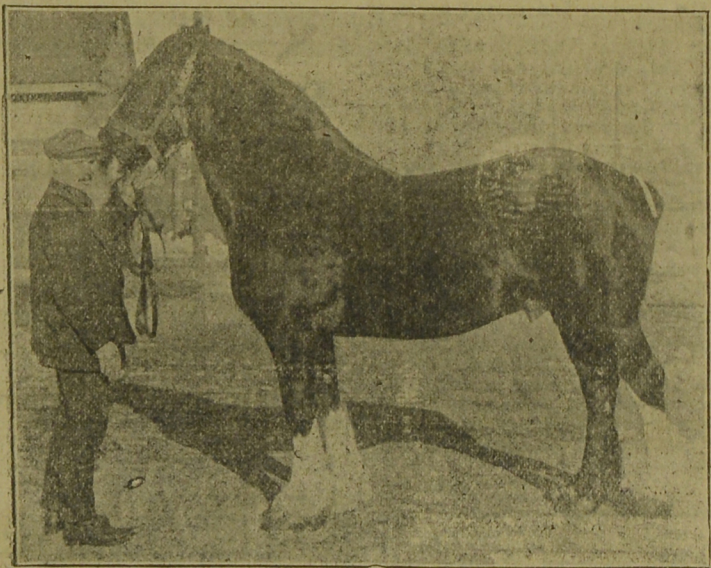

BERT LINT THROWN AT PRESQUE ISLE TUESDAY

Tryfast Won First Heat of 2.30 Mixed Class--Two Horses Ran Over Him in Smash-up--Pat Doherty's Vanza Won 2.16 Mixed Class in Straight Heats--Bangor Covered Mile in 2.14 1-2 in 2.30 Class Breaking Maine Trotting Stallion Record.

Presque Isle, Aug. 1. — The circuit races today were favored with perfect weather and a good attendance for the busy season, and most excellent racing and fast time. In the 2.30 class Tryfast led in the first heat but at the quarter pole a mishap caused him to fall, throwing Driver Lint twenty feet in the air. He was not injured and drove the next heat. Lady Carr and Azo T ran over Tryfast making quite a mix-up, smashing a wheel. Nothing daunted he kept on around the track, one axle hitting the ground. Dr. Hall made the last mile in 2.12 1/4, equalling the track record and distancing the field except Azo T. The 2.16 class was won easily by Vanza. In the 2.20 class Bangor trotted the first mile in 2.14 1/4, which broke the trotting stallion records for the state of Maine. He was driven by Mr. Tingley of Houlton and was well handled, taking three straight heats.

THE WEYMOUTH RECORD BROKEN

Frank Fox Not in the Money in the 2.19 Trot—Just Tess Put Up a Great Race.

Weymouth, Aug. 1. — Twice breaking the track record for pacers in one race and stirring finishes in two events that were carried to six and five heats respectively featured the first day's sport of the Bay State Short Ship Circuit this afternoon at the Agricultural Grounds, South Weymouth.

In the second heat of the 2.13 pacing class the bay gelding B-O went in 2.13 3/4, which broke the track record, and the fourth heat the bay horse, Colonel Forrest, had to go in 2.11 1/4 in order to win from B-O, and the track record again went by the board.

The bay mare Just Tess, after being kept out of first place in three heats by General French and Bettina, came back strong and won the next three heats and the race by close margins.

Four classes will race tomorrow with Koroni and Jess Y. among the headliners. The summary:
