QUEBEC WORKMEN

ENTER A PROTEST

Will Ask Borden Government to Reopen the Ross Rifle Factory.

Quebec, March 21.-A meeting that gathered over two thousand men of the working class at the City Hall yesterday deplored the government's action in closing down the Ross factory here without notice.

It was pointed out that Quebec City is losing \$50,000 weekly in salaries paid at the Ross rifle factory, and deep disturbances will be experienced in ocal business. Bankruptcy for a number of business places was forecasted. A petition was addressed to the Borden government asking that the factory be re-opened.

No "Suppers" Served After 7 o'Clock in the Morning.


Night life in Berlin before the war was "kolossal." Nothing like it had heretofore been seen.


