QUEBEC WORKMEN

ENTER A PROTEST

Will Ask Borden Government to Re-open the Ross Rifle Factory.

Quebec, March 21.—A meeting that gathered over two thousand men of the working class at the City Hall yesterday deplored the government's action in closing down the Ross rifle factory here without notice.

It was pointed out that Quebec City is losing \$50,000 weekly in salaries paid at the Ross rifle factory, and deep disturbances will be experienced in local business. Bankruptcy for a number of business places was forecasted.

A petition was addressed to the Borden government asking that the factory be re-opened.

THE UNITED STATES MAY MAY SOON ENTER WAR

London, March 21.—"According to private telegrams from Berlin to the Amsterdam Bourse, it is expected that a state of war with the United States will be an accomplished fact within forty-eight hours," says a despatch to the Exchange Telegraph from Amsterdam.

"American journalists in Berlin," the despatch adds, "have been warned to this effect by the foreign office."

New York, March 21.—Hope that the "Stars and Stripes" would soon be waving over the trenches in France," drew cheers from 100 clergymen of many denominations here today, when it was expressed in an address before them by Major Charles W. Gordon, of the 43rd Canadian Infantry, better known as "Ralph Connor," the author.

Major Gordon is here on a mission for the British War Office. He will soon go back to his regiment, now in Flanders.

No "Suppers" Served After 7 o'Clock in the Morning.

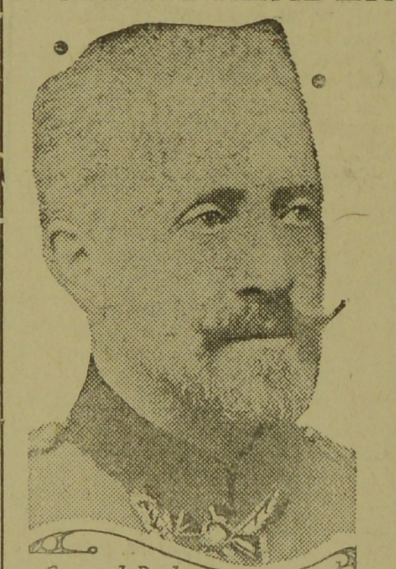
Night life in Berlin before the war was "kolossal." Nothing like it had heretofore been seen.

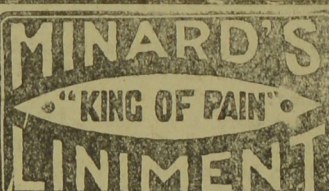

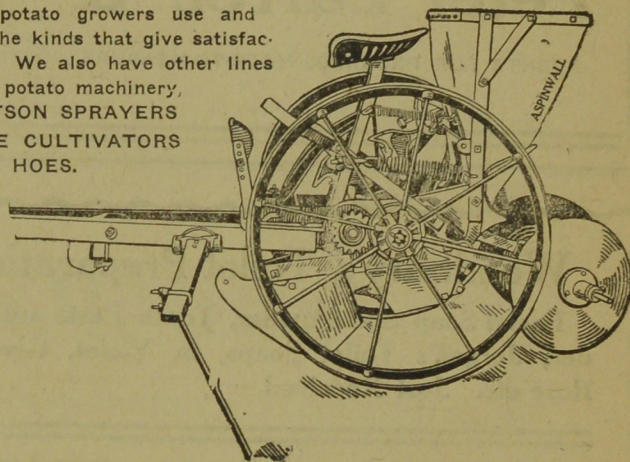

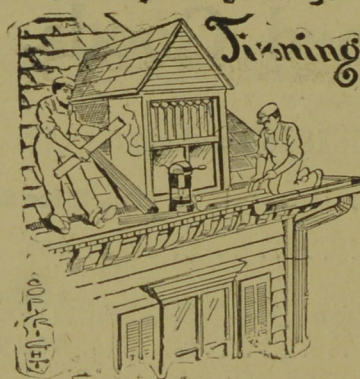
