London, March 15.—The British line southwest of Doiran, on the Macedon ian front, has been advanced 1,000s yards over a front of 3,500 yards, says a despatch received from Salonika to day. The British trenches are thus brought in places to within a couple of hundred yards of the German-Bulgarian advanced lines. The operation was carried out at night and met with no opposition.

The new line, the despatch points out, possesses several advantages. It shortens the front by straighten ing the salient on Horseshoe Hill, which has aldways been an exposed position. It also strengthens the British defences by the addition of an extra line of trenches. 
