THREE KING'S COUNSEL RECENTLY APPOINTED, CALLED THIS MORNING

Mr. J. P. Byrne, M. P. P. Yet to Be Called--Argument Finished in John Palmer Co. vs Palmer-McLellan Co.

Three of the recently appointed King's Counsel were called within the inner bar at this morning's sitting of Appeal Court. They are Mr. James Friel, of Dorchester, Mr. G. H. V. Belyea, of St. John, and Mr. R. B. Hanson, of Fredericton. The commissions were presented by Dr. T. C. Allen, registrar of the Supreme Court, and the King's Counsel were called within the bar by Sir Ezekiel McLeod, the Chief Justice.

Agreement Continued.
Argument in the case of the John Palmer Co., Ltd., vs. the Palmer-McLellan Shoe Co., Ltd., was continued this morning. Mr. H. A. Powell, K. C., for the defendant company, appellant, and Mr. M. G. Teed, K. C., for the plaintiff.

Westmorland County Case.
The case of M. C. McCormack vs. Hannah Gallagher, a county court appeal from Westmorland and the last case on the appeal docket, was argued this afternoon. The plaintiff, a real estate agent, recovered payment for \$355 before Judge Borden and a jury for commission on securing for the tenant for the Minto Hotel, Moncton, in 1915. The business was transacted through Mr. Patrick Gallagher, husband of the defendant, and it is claimed that agency and the right to bind the defendant were not sufficiently

BROWN SENT UP TO COUNTY COURT ON SECOND CHARGE

Two Criminal Cases to be Heard Next Week--Action For Recovery of Money Loaned is Entered.

Fred Brown was sent up for trial by Police Magistrate Limerick this morning on the charge of adultery. He was sent up some days ago on the charge of harboring girls under the age of eighteen years, for immoral purposes. These cases will come before the York County Court, which will begin its sitting on Tuesday next. They will comprise the entire criminal docket, according to present expectations. Both are very serious offences. They arose out of a raid by the police on a livery stable in the city, which disclosed unsavory conditions.

Civil Docket.
A new case entered in the civil docket is the action of Annie M. A. Giles vs. Percy G. Gunn, to recover money loaned. The plaintiff is a resident of Kingsclear and the defendant of Sussex. Mr. Havelock Coy is to appear for the plaintiff and Mr. C. D. Richards for the defendant.

Police Case Postponed.
Action against Police Sergeant Marshall, of this city, in connection with Canada Temperance Act enforcement, has not been entered yet at this sitting of the court. It is understood that a policeman, under the Fredericton Police Commission Act, must be given certain notice of action and that in this case the required notice was not given and action must be postponed.

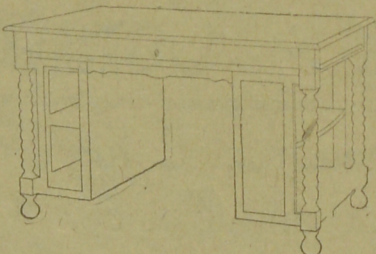
