

FEDERATION OF LABOR WANTS NEW LEGISLATION

Important Resolutions Adopted Yesterday Afternoon--Committee Interviewed the Provincial Government This Morning--Address of Welcome by Ald. Walker--Rev. W. D. Wilson Also Spoke.

The New Brunswick Federation of Labor yesterday afternoon appointed a committee to wait upon the Provincial Government and interview it in regard to legislation of interest to the Federation. The committee was composed of the following: President J. L. Sugrue, chairman; Delegates Tighe, McKinnon, Bruce, Ryan, Steeves, Harrison and Crawford. This committee interviewed the Legislative Committee at 11 o'clock this morning.

Formal Opening.

Yesterday afternoon the convention formally opened. In the absence of Mayor Mitchell, who is in Edmundston, Alderman Joseph Walker welcomed the delegates. Rev. W. D. Wilson, inspector under the Prohibitory Act, also delivered an address. Mr. Wilson was formerly interested in labor movements in Scotland and spoke upon labor subjects. He concluded his remarks by asking the Federation to support in every way the enforcement of the Prohibitory Act.

To these addresses President Sugrue replied.

Resolutions Passed.

Consideration of resolutions presented to the Federation occupied the attention of the convention at the afternoon session. They were passed as follows:

1. Opposing as class legislation the legislation promoted by the City of Moncton for the imposition of a tax of one per cent. per head upon the persons attending picture shows and other places of amusement.
2. Favoring the system of proportional representation on the ground of the recognition of the right of a minor-

ity to be represented in legislative bodies, and petitioning the provincial government to put such a system into effect.

3. Demanding that motormen and street railway conductors be given instruction by competent persons for a period of not less than fourteen days before being placed at work.

4. Asking for amendment of the existing Factory Act or a new act on the ground that the existing act is ineffective and totally inadequate in the matter of the employment of women and children, the imposition of penalties, and other matters.

5. Asking that additional provincial officials, one of whom shall be a woman, be appointed to lighten the duties of the present factory inspector, who is required to attend to too many duties, namely, inspection of factories, theatres, hotels, fire escapes, etc., examination of engineers, etc., enforcement of the Factory Act.

6. Free school books up to Grade 5.
7. That the law relative to the securing of wages from employers of labor by the process of law when it becomes necessary to obtain a lien be amended so as to eliminate expense and guarantee payment without recourse to law.

8. That the Provincial government be memorialized to provide that the union label be used on all government printing as a guarantee of fair working conditions.

9. That all delegates demand union label on the goods they purchase and urge their memberships to do the same.

GERMAN CHANCELLOR IS A BUSY MAN

Berlin May 13--via London 14--While the Baiting of the imperial chancellor is going on, the events of the past forty-eight hours would seem to indicate that Von Bethmann-Hollweg's position continues to be absolutely secure. The chancellor returned from a hurried visit to German Headquarters Saturday morning and left the same night for Vienna after having spent the day in conferring with the Reichstag party leaders with respect to the interpellations on Germany's war aims.

Both his visit to Great Headquarters and his trip to the Austrian capital were made in connection with the Chancellor's declaration covering the war aims, which he will submit to the Reichstag Tuesday. Both the government and the middle road parties are desirous of avoiding an extensive or a scintillating debate, and representatives of the latter will unite in a joint statement or present independent coincidences declarations. It is contended that the Chancellor holds enough strong cards in the present military situation, the success of the U boats, the record sixth war loan and the improvement in the food situation to keep off his opponents, who have been at his heels for months past.

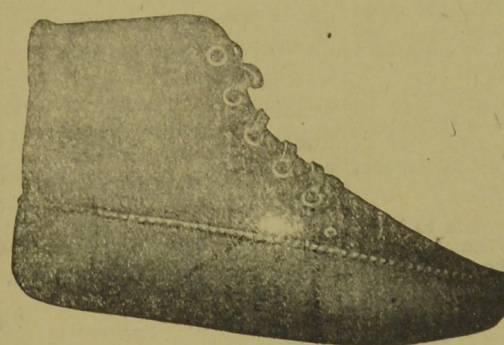
