

Soreness Against Judges Last Threat of Government Tax or Receipts is Making Owners of Clubs Think of Economy.

New oYrk, May 14. - If the war tax Cox has withdrawn his entire string of pacers and trotters from the Grand pacers and trotters from the Grand Circuit races at Charter Oak Track here.
