COX HORSES WITHDRAWN AT CHARTER OAK

Soreness Against Judges Last Autumn Cause of Action —Makes Big Hole in Entry List.

Hartford, Conn., May 14—Walter Cox has withdrawn his entire string of pacers and trotters from the Grand Circuit races at Charter Oak Track here.

This was done, is said, because of the alleged unfair decision made by the judges last fall in the race in which Mabel Trask and St. Frisco were the stars, and which Cox lost.

Cox had several entries, but asked that different judges than those who ruled last year be in the stand this fall or he would withdraw his entries. The directors refused this request and the withdrawal followed.

Mabel Trask was entered in the Battle Royal.

Thirty-six 2 and 3-year-old trotters are entered in the early closing events for these youngsters, 22 in the race for 2-year-olds and 14 in the events for 3-year-olds.

The Battle Royal, the first one to be arranged for the Grand Circuit, drew only three entries to stay, Volga, Zomrect and St. Frisco. The entries do not close in this race, however, until Aug. 20.

LANGFORD HAD TOO MUCH FAT

Philadelphia, May 11. — Sam Langford, fat and in no condition to box, went six rounds with Harry Wills of New Orleans before the Cambria A. C. tonight. The Boston boxer did little but clinch and stall off every attempt of Wills to make him fight.

The New Orleans boxer forced the fighting throughout, but owing to Sam's covering-up tactics, could not land a decisive blow.

ATHLETICS SIGN CON MURPHY

Malden, May 11. — Cornelius Murphy, captain of the Dartmouth varsity baseball team and ex-Malden High captain, has signed a contract with Connie Mack's Philadelphia Athletics. He will begin work at the close of the college term. Murphy is considered one of the best backstops in college baseball.

LEONARD HAS FOUR IN ROW

New York, May 11—Benny Leonard scored his fourth consecutive knockout by stopping Eddie Shannon, of San Francisco, in the sixth round of a ten-round bout in Brooklyn last night. Shannon's seconds "threw up the sponge" when he was floored with a right uppercut. Leonard weighed 133½ pounds and Shannon 136½.

BASEBALL STARS MAY GET SALARIES CUT

Threat of Government Tax on Receipts is Making Owners of Clubs Think of Economy.

New York, May 14. — If the war tax on baseball receipts becomes a hardship for the major league clubs it is probable that the players' salaries will be reduced before the season ends. The magnates say that if the receipts fall off because the fans are compelled to pay the tax imposed by the government, heavy financial losses will follow unless radical measures are adopted. Players who signed the new form of contract several months ago can be released at ten days' notice. In that case they can be signed all over again for less money or go into retirement.

There is no Federal league to which the players can jump and no Fraternity to call a general strike. So the players will be at the mercy of the magnates if the latter are forced to reduce expenses. Already the major league clubs have lost thousands of dollars because of inclement weather. The month of May generally is the most profitable, but if the weather continues to knock out the schedules until the last of the month, even double-headers later on will not make up the deficit.

The major leagues have contracted to pay \$1,500,000 in salaries this year, but the ten days' release clause in many of the contracts may prove an anchor to windward.

When the National league meets in special session here on Saturday the proposed war tax will be seriously considered in all its ramifications. It is probable that the American league also will be called in session by President Johnson to consider the crisis. But there is no idea of closing the ball parks in the big circuits. The magnates intend to keep baseball alive, regardless of the cost.
