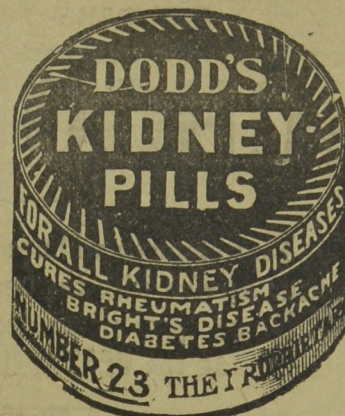

with the final half in 1.02.

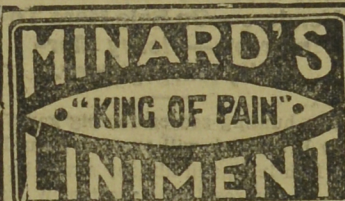
