HOUSEHOLD RECIPES

MIXING MUSTARD.

English mustard is mixed thus: Mustard, three parts, salt, one part, mixed with hot water till free from lumps and smooth.

American way of mixing mustard is thus: One tablespoonful of ground mustard, one-fourth teaspoonful of sugar, a pinch of salt and vinegar to make a smooth paste, or water may be added instead of vinegar.

French mustard: Work together until smooth three tablespoonfuls of mustard and one of sugar, then add one egg well beaten, one teacupful of vinegar, adding the vinegar gradually to prevent the mustard being lumpy. Beat altogether, then place over water and

cook a few minutes. Take from the fire and when nearly cool beat in a teaspoonful of olive oil.

MINCE MEAT.

Follow this recipe: One pound of suet (beef), two pounds of lean beef, one quart chopped apples, one-half cup of candied orange peel, same of lemon peel, one-half pound citron peel, three cups of seeded raisins, juice and grated rind of one lemon and one orange one cup of currants, one-half cup good molasses, one cup or more (according to taste) of dark sugar one teaspoonful of cinnamon, one-half teaspoonful cloves, one nutmeg (grated), two cups of boiled cider.

Let the meat simmer slowly in a covered kettle until tender; run

through meat chopper and mix with the suet, which has been put through the chopper. Add other ingredients in the order named, chopping the citron, orange and lemon before mixing. Put in a stone crock or jar; cover and let stand a week or ten days to ripen.

The woman did not resist. According to physicians, she was too weak. A tube was inserted in her mouth and nourishing liquid food was administered. The patient was then put to bed.

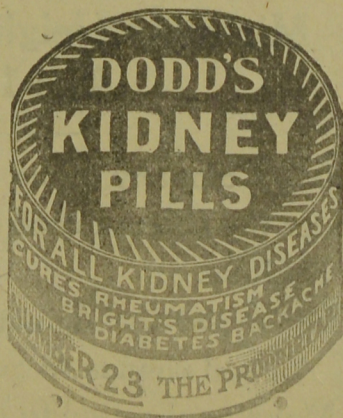
