BE PREPARED RECIPES.

Chili Sauce.

Skin and cut twelve tomatoes into small pieces. Chop two large onions and four green peppers fine; add four tablespoonfuls sugar, three tablespoon fuls salt, one teaspoonful each ground cloves and cinnamon. Boil mixture slowly for two hours.

Bordeaux Sauce.

Two quarts chopped cabbage, one water over the leaves from 20 stalks quart chopped green tomatoes, three of mint, cover and let simmer an hour, quarts chopped onions, one pound of then add 1 cup of sugar, strain and sugar, one-quarter cup salt, one-half allow to cool.
