## OF INTEREST TO WOMEN.

### BE PREPARED RECIPES.

#### Chili Sauce.

Skin and cut twelve tomatoes into small pieces. Chop two large onions and four green peppers fine; add four tablespoonfuls sugar, three tablespoonfuls salt, one teaspoonful each, ground cloves and cinnamon. Boil mixture slowly for two hours.

#### Bordeaux Sauce.

Two quarts chopped cabbage, one quart chopped green tomatoes, three quarts chopped onions, one pound of sugar, one-quarter cup salt, one-half ounce mustard seed, one-quarter ounce celery seed, one-quarter ounce tumeric and one quart vinegar. Chop vegetables fine, mix all together and boil two hours.

#### Chutney Sauce.

One dozen sour apples, one dozen ripe tomatoes, one-quarter of a pound each of brown sugar and mustard, one-half pound chopped onions, one pound chopped seeded raisins, one ounce of whole cloves and three pints of vinegar. Grate the apples, cut tomatoes in small pieces, add the other ingredients and boil all together until cooked to a pulp. Put through colander, turn into jars and seal.

#### Corn Sauce.

To six ears of corn allow one large head of cabbage, four peppers, three teaspoonfuls each of celery seed and mustard seed, one cup of sugar, two teaspoonfuls mustard, one teaspoonful tumeric, two tablespoonfuls cornstarch and three pints of vinegar. Chop the cabbage and salt down one hour. Add sugar and salt to the vinegar and boil, thickening with cornstarch. Add other ingredients and boil ten minutes. Put in jars and seal.

#### BEEF HASH.

Chop left-over beef very fine and season with salt, pepper and a little

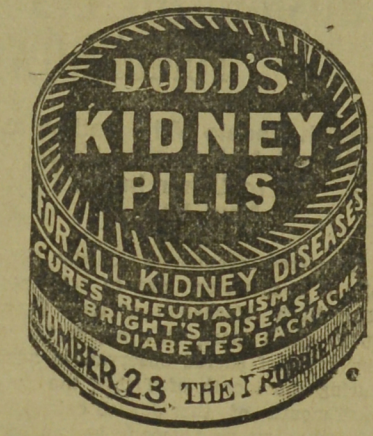

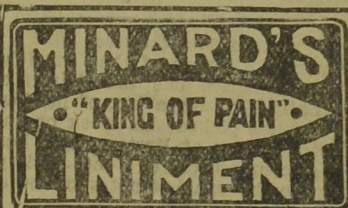
