SIR A CONAN DOYLE'S BOOK ON THE GREAT WAR

There is no period of the war which has a deeper or more absorbing interest for the student of history and of military operations than those fateful midsummer and autumn months in 1914, when the trained legions of Prussia were being poured in a seemingly endless stream against "that contemptible little army" which held the British lines in Flanders. Up to this time we have never had a complete narrative of those momentous and critical days. That lack has now been supplied by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle in his book, "The British Campaign in France and Flanders, 1914," which the well known publishing house of Hodder & Stoughton has just issued. No British writer is more competent to deal with the events of that campaign; none has had greater and freer opportunity for observing the events of which he writes so vividly than Sir Arthur Conan Doyle.

He has produced a book which The British Weekly, no mean authority, has pronounced a classic. It gives us for the first time a coherent story of the military movements based upon an accumulation of evidence from first hand sources. The author has in many cases, we are told, been privileged to submit his descriptions of the principal incidents, to prominent actors in them, and to receive their correction and endorsement, and he is thus able to state that a great deal

his book is not only accurate, but it is very precisely correct in its detail.

It is, therefore, a very complete narrative of the campaign, in which many new details are added and some obscure points are cleared up.

Like all Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's works, this book is a literary product of high quality and concerning his "unrivalled skill as a narrator," we can cite no higher authority than that master critic, Sir Robertson Nicol.

RUSSIAN STATESMEN HAD LIVELY SCRAP

Petrograd via London, Jan. 17.—A dramatic clash between Protopopoff, Minister of the interior, and M. Rodzianko, president of the Duma, is described by the Novoe Vremya. According to this story, M. SOCIAL SERVICE CON- GRESS IN ST. JOHN

Every reader of this paper is interested in the Social Service Congress to be held in the Knights of Columbus Hall, St. John, on January 23rd and 24th. This is a part of a nation-wide movement in which the people of Canada, regardless of creed, are asked to unite and to organize for social uplift. Congresses have already been held in Calgary, Regina and Winnipeg, and others are to be held in Halifax, St. John, Charlottetown and in Quebec and Ontario. They are held under the auspices of the Social Service Council of Canada.

Men of international reputation will deliver addresses at the St. John Congress. They include Raymond Robbins, of Chicago, who is one of the finest speakers on the continent; Dr. Moore, Dr. Shearer and Dr. Pidgeon, of Toronto; Canon Tucker, of London, and Dr. Bryce, of Ottawa. There will also be addresses by prominent New Brunswick men who are especially qualified to speak on different phases of social service.

Some of the subjects to be dealt with are: Social Reconstruction After the War; Prohibition; The Home, Its Perils and Safeguards; Women in Industrial life, Political Life, Social and Religious Life; The Patronage System and Graft; The Care of Dependents, Defectives and Delinquents; Urban and Rural Life; Gambling; Social Application of Christianity; The Nation's Greatest Heritage—its Children; The Children's Rights and Our Responsibilities.

Religious and other organizations throughout the province should endeavor to send delegates to this Congress which, it is hoped, will result in an effective organization, province-wide, for social service. Any man or woman interested in the movement will be cordially welcomed.
