OF INTEREST TO WOMEN

YOUR COLOR.

There are two types of women, generally speaking, the blonde and the brunette. These two can be divided into classes. For instance, the blonde type consists of the fair blonde and the ruddy blonde. Among the brunettes are two types the pale brunette and the florid brunette.

The fair blonde is distinguished by her pale skin with just a suspicion of pink, eyes of soft blue color and flaxen or light hair. This type needs a color that is warming, bringing out the delicate pink of the complexion, deepening the eyes and enriching the hair. Green, blue, if not too dark, white and most all delicate colors are suitable for those in this class.

The fair blonde should avoid orange, yellow, purple, brown and red. The ruddy blonde has darker eyes and hair, and a more colorful complexion. She can wear about the same colors, perhaps of deeper tones.

The pale brunette type has a pale skin, deep brown eyes or eyes of brown black hue, and hair of dark, rich brown. A person of this description should be very cautious about using white, as it is apt to increase any sallowness in her complexion. Cream is better. Dull black is good, but the glossy black should be avoided. The pale brunette should avoid light blues. Dark blues if relieved by cream are usually becoming. Brown, if a dark, rich shade, can be worn by this class, but the most becoming

colors are the warm ones, such as claret, old rose, deep russet, gold and maize. Greens and pale pinks should be shunned.

The florid, brilliant brunette has black hair, dark complexion, and a deep coloring and dark brown or black eyes. This type looks well in dark red, in dark blue, olive greens, rich maize or gold and old rose. Light blues, light greens and pale violets are not becoming. Black combined with cream yellow is very good.

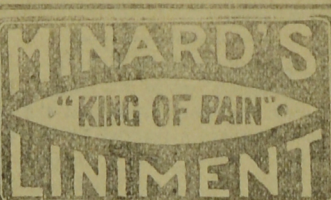
The Ambassador speaks of Dr. Beland's coming release, and adds that all people interned in both countries who are over forty-five years of age, will shortly be exchanged.

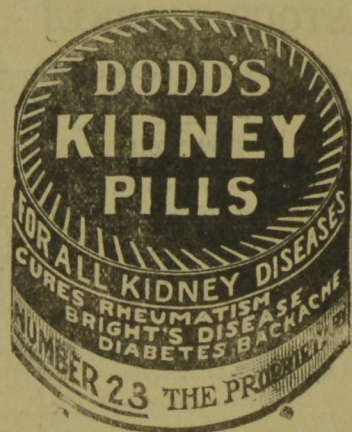
WORLDLY WISDOM.

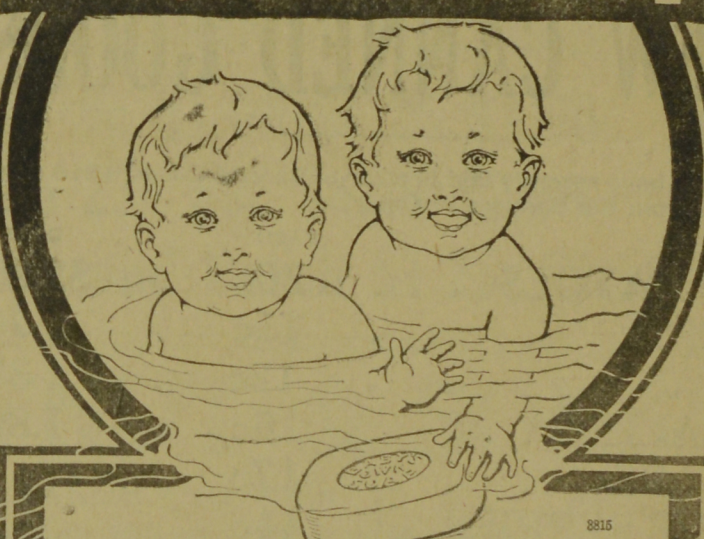
