

Few Jobs in the Gift of the Federal Government go to Returned Soldiers---Mr. Baxter's Gallery Play in the House of Assembly Creates a Lot of Amusement ---Some Interesting Correspondence.

Bell is chairman, and Colonel Baxter a member of the returned sol-diers' committee, and the good job of secretary is filled by Charles Robin-son, who draws \$1,200 a year and ex-penses. There are many young gen-tlmen who have fought in the trenches and have returned who could fill that position. The government does not make the appointment. Colonel Bax-ter and Chairman Bell made it. 




