

GOVERNMENT CANDIDATES WERE RETURNED IN YORK

Opposition Put up a Splendid Fight Against Tremendous Odds---Big Majorities Cut Down Almost to the Vanishing Point---The Government workers made Good Use of Rum and Money---The Hatchet Was Dug Up.

A big bonfire blazing in Queen street in front of the Opposition Committee Rooms, a cheering crowd thronging those rooms, "Hurrah for the Liberals!" shouted in the street, all were Fredericton's way of celebrating the Opposition victory in the general provincial election on Saturday. On account of the closeness of the standing of the two parties, any celebration had to be postponed until very late. It was not until after eleven o'clock that it was definitely announced that the two Opposition candidates had been elected in Queens. When that word was received showing that the Opposition had taken 23 seats to the Government's 21, the cheering began.

The result in York was a disappointment to the Opposition workers, as it had been thought that Mr. Burt and possibly one other candidate would be elected. This disappointment was balanced by the word received early that the Opposition was leading in Sunbury and Queens. When this was followed by definite word that the Opposition had made a clean sweep of the eastern and northern counties, it was known that the doom of the Murray government was sealed.

In York the Opposition, although failing to elect a man, put up a magnificent fight and already the feeling is "We'll get them next time!"

As expected, John A. Young was dropped by many Government supporters, running about 200 votes behind the ticket. The others ran close together. Elwood Burt led the Opposition ticket, and was only 264 votes behind Young. In June 1912 the Government majority in York was 2,310. Saturday it was 483. This indicates the great turnover which took place in this county.

In Sunbury.

The magnificent victory of David W. Mersereau and Robert B. Smith in Sunbury was received with joy. Geo. A. Perley and Parker Glasier, the defeated Government ticket, were both members of the old House. The victors are making their debut in provincial politics. Mr. Glasier had represented Sunbury continuously since 1900. Mr. Mersereau's many friends are delighted with the fact that he led

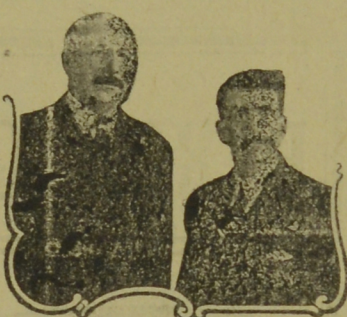

The Opposition Candidates Achieved a Most Remarkable Victory.

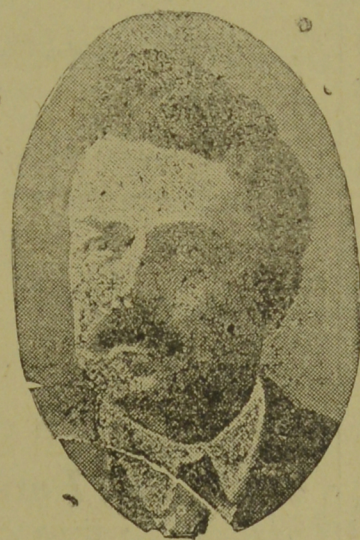
One of the most significant victories of the campaign was achieved by Messrs. D. W. Mersereau and Robert B. Smith, the Opposition candidates in Sunbury. Mr. Smith, who led the poll, had 117 more votes than Mr. Glasier, who has represented the county continuously for eighteen years, and he led Mr. Perley by 129. The parish of Gladstone, where Mr. J. B. Daggett

spent most of his time during the campaign, gave them almost a two to one vote. Mr. Perley was defeated by a small majority in his home parish of Mauderville, while the Government stronghold of Lincoln gave Mr. Glasier a lead of only 27.
