> 4. Men who, having been taken on the strength of a unit of the C. E. F or of the active militia, either as volunteers or as drafted men and either before or after the issue of the proclamation under the Military Service Act, or the passing of that act, are now, or hereafter become absentees without leave-punishable by civil magistrates by two years' imprisonment with the consent of the general officer commanding the district where the proclamation is brought o by military law.

5. Men who have been granted leave of absence with pay, cease of fail to comply with the conditions up on which their leave was granted punishable in the same way as men group 4.
