SEASONABLE RECIPES.

Chocolate Fruit Cookies.
Cream together a quarter of a cup of shortening and half a cup of sugar. Add two tablespoons of grated chocolate that has been melted with a tablespoon of sugar and a tablespoon of boiling water. Then add a beaten egg, half a cup each of chopped nut meats and seeded raisins, and a cup of flour sifted with a teaspoon of baking powder. Chill, roll thin and cut. Bake in moderate oven.

Pineapple Snow.

One-half box of gelatin or jelly powder, half a cup of cold water, one can pineapple, one cup of sugar. Soak the gelatin in the water half an hour. Take half the juice of the can of pineapple and add enough cold water to make a pint; stir in the sugar and boil three minutes. Pour boiling hot upon the gelatin. Let it stand until it begins to thicken, then beat it until it looks like white cream. Let it harden sufficiently to hold up fruit, then add half a cup of the pineapple, which has been chopped fine. Pour into mold and set away to harden. Turn out of mold and serve with or without cream.

Cod Steaks.

Select a medium-sized fresh codfish, cut it in steaks crosswise of the fish, about an inch and a half thick; sprinkle a little salt over them and let stand two hours. Cut into dice a pound of salt fat pork, fry out all the fat and remove the crisp bits of pork; put the codfish steaks in a pan of cornmeal, dredge them with it, and when the pork fat is smoking hot, fry the steaks in it, to a dark brown color on both sides. Squeeze over them a little lemon juice, add a dash of fresh ground pepper and serve.

Rice Muffins.

Three-fourths cup of cooked rice, three-fourths cup sifted wheat flour, a half teaspoon salt, one teaspoon baking powder, one tablespoon sugar, one egg, one tablespoon shortening; liquid to make a rather stiff batter. Sift together the flour, salt, sugar and baking powder twice. Beat the egg until light and add the melted shortening, then the flour mixture, alternating with portions of the liquid until a batter is formed somewhat stiffer than for ordinary flour muffins. Drop by spoonfuls into greased muffin pans until half filled and bake twenty to twenty-five minutes in a fairly hot oven.

VICTORY LOAN ALLOTMENTS

Ottawa, Dec. 28. — Sir Thomas White, the minister of finance, has decided to make allotments to the Victory Loan subscribers as follows:

- (1) Subscriptions of five hundred thousand dollars and under allotted in full.
- (2) Over five hundred thousand dollars and up to and including one million dollars, five hundred thousand in full and seventy-five of balance.
- (3) Over a million dollars same as (2) for first million and fifty per cent. of amount in excess of one million dollars.

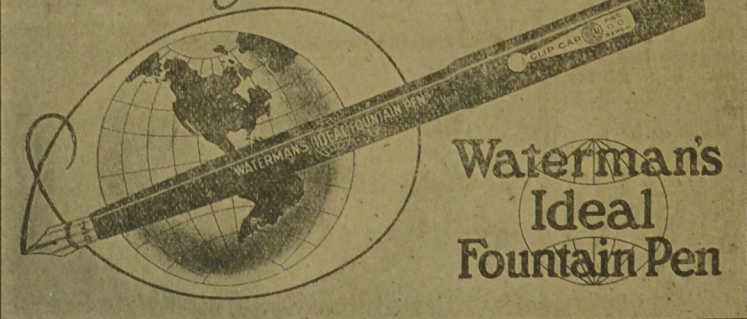
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
