WITH LEFT OVER COFFEE.

It is usually rather difficult to know just what amount of coffee you will need for breakfast-unless your family is small and their habits unvariable. Then, of course, you should make just enough and no more, for nowadays one does not feel justified in leaving anything unused.

But where it is impossible to tell, the next best thing is to make use of left over coffee.

The first thing to remember is that it should be poured off from the pot in which it was made immediately after breakfast is over. The reason why stale coffee has an unpleasant taste is cacy of the first flavor.

Pour off the coffee in a cup or earthen pitcher and let it remain covered 2 cupfuls of flour to the liquid. Cover with a saucer till it is needed. Here and place where it is warm to rise for are some ways to use it.
