OF INTEREST TO WOMEN.

WITH LEFT OVER COFFEE.

It is usually rather difficult to know just what amount of coffee you will need for breakfast—unless your family is small and their habits unvariable. Then, of course, you should make just enough and no more, for nowadays one does not feel justified in leaving anything unused.

But where it is impossible to tell, the next best thing is to make use of left over coffee.

The first thing to remember is that it should be poured off from the pot in which it was made immediately after breakfast is over. The reason why stale coffee has an unpleasant taste is usually because it has lain on its own grounds long enough to lose the delicacy of the first flavor.

Pour off the coffee in a cup or earthen pitcher and let it remain covered with a saucer till it is needed. Here are some ways to use it.

Coffee Jelly.

This is delicious for dinner and may be served with or without whipped cream.

Soak a half box of gelatin in a half cupful of cold water for half an hour, and pour over it a cupful of strong coffee that has been brought to the boiling point. Stir until it is dissolved, and then add three-fourths of a cupful of sugar and a cupful of boiling water. Strain through a fine sieve in a single or individual moulds, and when cool set on ice to harden. If the coffee is not strong, do not use so much hot water, but more of the coffee mixture.

Coffee Blanc Mange.

To 1 cupful of cold coffee add a cupful of milk and bring to a boil. Add 2 tablespoonfuls of sugar and thicken

with two tablespoonfuls of cornstarch that has been rubbed smooth in a very little cold milk. Cool in moulds and serve with cream.

Coffee Frosting.

Often a little left-over coffee can be used in making cake frosting. The easiest way is to add to a cupful of coffee to make a suitable icing.

confectioners' sugar enough strong Coffee Custard.

This is made by following any good custard recipe and using a half cupful of strong coffee for every quart of milk.

CURRENT BREAD.

Dissolve a cake of compressed yeast in a tablespoonful of sugar in a cupful of lukewarm water and the same amount of lukewarm milk that has been scalded. Cream $\frac{3}{4}$ cupful of sugar with 4 tablespoonfuls of butter and add with 2 cupfuls of flour to the liquid. Cover and place where it is warm to rise for an hour or an hour and a half. Then, if it is well risen, add a cupful of flour, raisins and 4 cupfuls more of flour, then a teaspoonful of salt. Knead lightly and place in a greased bowl to rise again, for about an hour, covered. Mold into loaves and put in well-greased pans, cover, and let rise until light—perhaps an hour or more. Beat an egg with a little lukewarm water and brush this mixture over the top of the loaves. Bake for three-quarters of an hour.

If ink is spilt on the tablecloth immediately melt a candle, taking some of the tallow, spread it over the ink patch and leave it to dry. Afterward wash the tablecloth and all traces of ink will disappear.
