vate property.

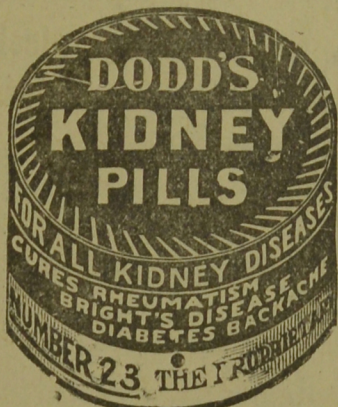
The owner of such animals found

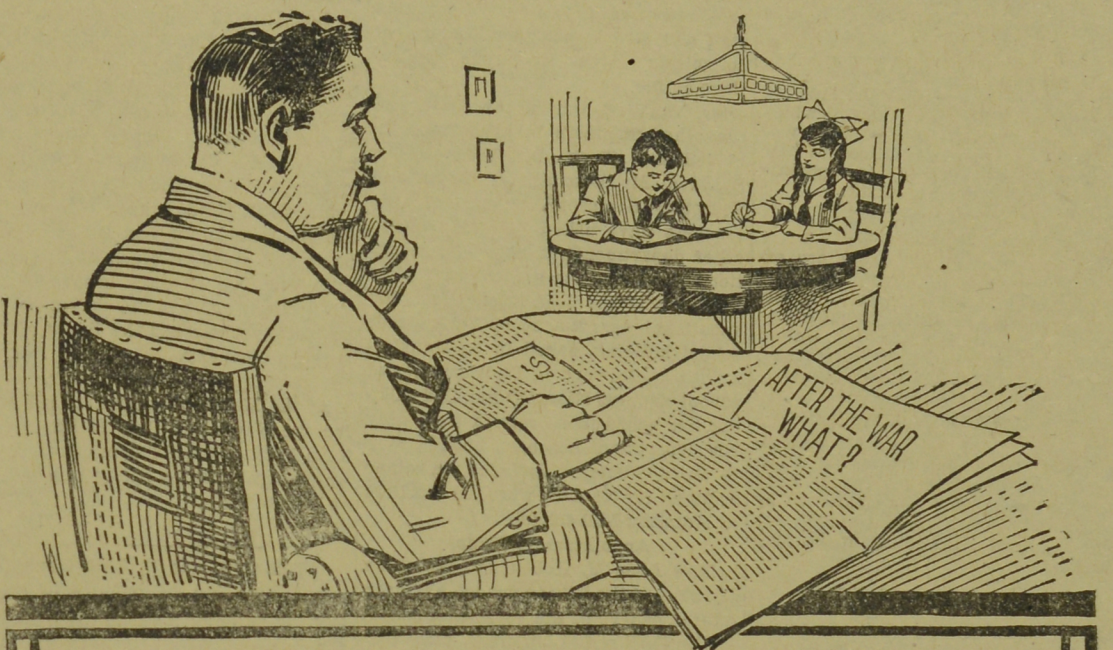

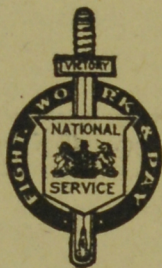
