

SOME EXCELLENT SPEECHES HEARD IN THE LEGISLATURE

Mr. Robichaud Pays His Respects to the Government Which Got Shipwrecked On February 24th--Dr. McGrath Tells Of the Valuable Assets Which the Province Possesses--Additional Revenue Must be Provided by the Government.

Mr. Robichaud of Gloucester, Dr. McGrath of Northumberland and Mr. Melanson and Mr. Dysart of Kent, contributed good speeches to the debate on the budget in the Legislature last evening. All are new members of the House but already they have given proof that they are paying close attention to the business of the province.

Mr. Robichaud's Speech.
Mr. Robichaud said he should have to ask the forbearance of the House with regard to the few words he had to say because although the language in which he was going to speak was spoken in every corner of the globe, he was not sufficiently familiar with it to do it justice. He wished to congratulate the Speaker upon the impartial way he was presiding and also the Premier upon the businesslike way in which he had taken up the business of the province. Although insinuations had been flung across the House that he was too young and inexperienced, it was no crime to be inexperienced, but it was worse than a crime for those who claimed to be experienced to have allowed the ship of state to be wrecked as it was on the 24th of February. The party now in power were doing their best to right it and would try to put it permanently on the safe way. When he listened to the hon. member from St. John (Potts) yesterday and heard him say that there was great need for a Minister of Truth, he could not help thinking that his hon. friend had made the discovery rather late in the day. If hon. gentlemen opposite had been guided by a Minister of Truth they would still be sitting on the

right hand side of the House. He (Robichaud) was not born a politician, but it did not need a politician to tell the truth. He was in the House because when he walked about his county and saw the way money was being spent by the late government he could not help feeling it was shamefully wasted. Money was spent when there was no occasion and because he had taken some prominent part in showing up this waste he had been asked to become a candidate for the House. There were lots of ways of spending money wrongfully. Thousands of dollars were spent in his county in November and December in each year, not to improve the roads but for political purposes. Men who were in charge had been complained of and when the complaints were made the men were simply transferred to some other place. The roads should be taken out of politics and then they would perhaps get some good roads. He had great faith in the future of the province and one of the most satisfactory ways of safeguarding the future was to take care of the roads as thereby the general prosperity would be promoted. Besides roads they must also have railways. Nothing would stimulate production better than good transportation facilities. Increased facilities for education, particularly along agricultural lines, was also desirable. The young people should be taught to stay in the province. Few people have any right knowledge of the real wealth of New Brunswick. If it was in the power of the Legislature to afford additional means of instruction in agricultural matters, he would like to see these means provided so that when the boys come home from the war they would

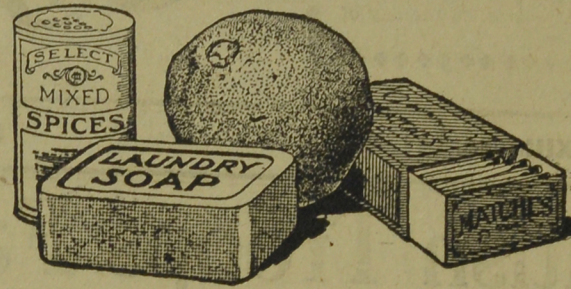

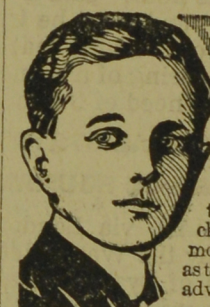
good deal more money than was needed. Nevertheless, they were going to build the Valley railway up to the same standard. He believed in building railways up to a good standard, because the better the standard the better the investment. As to the charges for interest which with that of the Valley railway it was said would amount to \$630,000, the province had assumed the debt and must pay it so there was no more to be said. The main thing was to provide for it. He agreed with some of the previous speakers that some slight increase in stumpage might reasonably be made though he did not favor making the burdens of the lumbermen any harder than they were obliged to. He was not sure that many of the scalers made honest returns and he thought a sharp eye should be kept on these men to see that they did their duty. If they did their duty properly there would be no difficulty in getting an increased revenue.

Dr. McGrath's Views.

Dr. McGrath congratulated the hon. Speaker on the forbearance he had shown in listening to the remarks of hon. gentlemen opposite. It seemed to him that the matter under discussion simmered down to a question of providing sufficient revenue to carry on the public services of the province. The matter had been discussed very fully but in only a few cases had it been dealt with from a business standpoint. The hon. member for York, for instance, had got somewhat mixed in attempting to figure out what percentage the province received from its crown lands. The province had different kinds of assets and he believed its forests and mines were worth not less than one hundred million dollars. The

hon. member for Westmorland assuming that the assets of the province yielded only one per cent. had suggested that the public domain be sold. He (McGrath) did not concur in this view, and he thought it a matter for regret that the province had not in the past

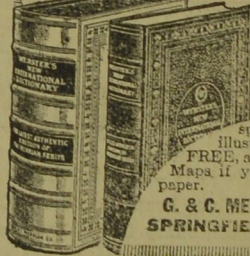
