

M'GRAW AGAIN MAKES SOME HOT REMARKS

Says Tener is Favoring Philadelphia—Will Appeal to the National Baseball Commission.

Pittsburg, Pa., June 15. — Notification of the penalty imposed upon him for his part in the fight with Umpire Byron in Cincinnati caused John McGraw, the peppery manager of the Giants, to give vent freely to his feelings in the matter, and his remarks on the decision of President Tener include a hot denunciation of that official.

"This is outrageous," declared the irate manager of the Giants. "I struck Byron only as a last resort in defense of my rights and resentment of an insult. Yet Tener sees fit to impose this penalty on me. A couple of years ago Charlie Herzog, then manager of the Reds, got into a fight with Umpire Rigler over a decision; yet Herzog was suspended only three days. The circumstances in this case were far more extenuating. I was publicly insulted by Byron and took the only means at my disposal to avenge the insult. I would have taken the same action against any other man and that goes for John K. Tener, too. Had he said to me what Byron did I would have punched his head just as readily."

"The decision in my case proves that the league is being run for Philadelphia, and that Tener has to be told what to do every time it is up to him to make a decision. If Mr. Tener is looking for trouble he will find it. I will put the whole affair up to the National Commission and appeal from his decision."

Rhubarb Recipes
Either Fresh, Stewed or Canned Rhubarb May be Used in These.

Rhubarb Pudding—Wash Style.
Line a buttered pudding dish with a layer of bread crumbs which have been soaked in water and lemon juice. Sprinkle with sugar and butter. Fill with rhubarb and stewed rhubarb which has been well sweetened. Fill dish with alternate layers of the crumbs and rhubarb, cover top with dry bread crumbs and bits of butter, bake 30 minutes covered, then uncover and bake for 10 minutes longer. Serve with a hard sauce flavored with nutmeg.

Rhubarb Sauce.
Cut fresh rhubarb into inch lengths and stew until tender. Strain through a sieve.

Mix two cups of sweetened juice with one ounce of gelatin which has been dissolved in cold water. Mold and serve on lettuce leaves with any preferred salad dressing.

Rhubarb and Raisins.
A delicious mixture for tarts is made of dates and rhubarb.
Stone a quarter pound of dates and stew for 5 minutes. Add 2 cups of rhubarb cut into inch lengths, and cook until rhubarb is tender. Sweeten to taste.

Raisins and figs can be used with rhubarb in the same way.

Raisins and figs may be canned together for pies.

MINOR LEAGUES REQUESTED TO CLOSE JULY 4

Chicago, June 14. — President A. T. Kearney of the Three I League tonight dispatched a telegram to 13 minor leagues requesting them to discontinue their respective schedules after July 4. Kearney's message was directed to every league of importance below Class A.

Kearney stated that this was the chief topic likely to come up for discussion at the meeting of the league. The financial collapse of two clubs has led Kearney to believe that the league would have to close its gates rather than run the risk of further financial setbacks with a league of six clubs.
