## CHARLIE CHAPLIN'S SALARY IS REAL COIN

New York Legislators Find Charlie Actually Gets \$750,000—War Has Cut Into Movie Profits.

Albany, N. Y., April 2.—Charlie Chaplin's salary is really \$750,000 a year, and perhaps by now a round million, according to the Wheeler Committee.

The evidence before the committee showed that even such salaries are not an unwise investment. The committee heard evidence that Douglas Fairbanks receives as much as Chaplin's present contract and that there are several other stars making more than \$500,000 a year.

The European war has played havoc with the profits of the movie men, and the committee therefore does not at this time recommend a rigorous tax.

An unexpected development of the report, however, was the strong recommendation for censorship which, the committee says, is backed by the best people in the picture business. Sex, vice and vampire films, the committee finds, are produced as a specialty by one large and two small companies in particular.

The committee finds that most of the tangible property of the industry is outside of the State, except the theatres, which are the least profitable end of the business, the smaller ones being barely able to make expenses since the cost of films has increased.

## RUSSIANS DRIVING TURKS BEFORE THEM

Petrograd, via London, April 2.—Russian troops moving westward from Kerend, in Persia, are approaching the Mesopotamian border near Khanikin, and continue to drive the Turks before them, today's War Office statement indicates. Two additional towns have been occupied by this column.

The more northerly column, which already has crossed the Mesopotamian border south of Baneh, held its newly won ground there, breaking up a Turkish offensive movement. The official statement reads:

"In the direction of Penjwin, about ten miles south of Baneh, our troops repulsed a Turkish offensive. In the direction of Khanikin our troops occupied Miataque and Serpoule. The pursuit of the Turks, who are retreating in the direction of Kasrichir, continues."

## FORMER GERMAN BOAT REACHES NEW YORK

New York, April 2.—The Associated Press carried the following today:

A former German passenger steamship, the Buelow, of 8,965 tons gross, arrived here today under the name of Trascos-Montes, and will be placed in trade between the United States and Bermuda, under charter by the Portuguese government to Quebec Steamship Co. The ship was self-detained at Lisbon when the war started, and was seized by Portuguese when hostilities began between that country and Germany.

The ship was formerly of the German-Lloyd line, and has made both trans-Atlantic and trans-Pacific voyages.






