LENTEN OR EASTER FARE.

Eggs are Rich in Protein, Material to Build and Repair the Body.

Children require this building material and mothers who give careful attention to child feeding are careful to provide eggs several times a week, even when their price is high.

How to get uniform results in cooking eggs, how to tell when an egg is "soft" or "medium" is often a difficult matter. The following method, suggested by experts belonging to the University of Illinois, is considered reliable.

Use a graniteware stewpan of one-quart capacity, put in one pint of water and heat over a quick fire. When the water boils hard, turn off the heat and put in one egg taken direct from a cool place. Cover the pan and let the egg remain undisturbed for six minutes. It will be what is known as soft boiled. For a medium boiled egg let it remain in the water 8 minutes.

Eggs Spanish Style.

Mix a little melted butter with boiled rice and spread on a well buttered baking dish. Arrange slices of hard boiled eggs on top of the rice, cover with tomato sauce, and bake ten minutes.

Cupped Eggs.

Butter individual baking dishes or custard cups. Put two tablespoonfuls of cream into each, then the yolk and white of a fresh egg. Season with pepper and salt. Set the cups in a pan of

boiling water, place in a very hot oven and steam until the eggs are set.

Baked Omelet.

Soak 1 cupful bread crumbs in a cupful of milk. Beat up the yolks of 3 eggs and stir into the bread and milk. Season with salt, add the well beaten whites of the eggs, turn into a well-buttered baking dish and bake 20 minutes.

Potato Omelet.

Use cold mashed potatoes for this dish. Mix 1 cupful of the potato with 1 cupful milk, and 1 tablespoonful of flour. Beat until smooth, add the beaten yolks of 3 eggs, with seasonings of salt, pepper and butter, then add the beaten whites of the eggs. Have a frying pan hot and well buttered, turn in the egg mixture, brown on one side, then turn and brown on the other. Garnish with parsley and serve with triangles of toast.

THE VERSATILE LEMON.

A few drops of plain lemon juice is an excellent and economical wash for the teeth, as it not only removes tartar, but sweetens the breath.

SPEAKER COBB AND JACKSON IN BATTING STRUGGLE

Outcome Doubtful With Each Famous Hitter Confident of Winning—Host Of Lesser Light Also Ready.

New York, March 31.—Tris Speaker's sudden elevation to the heights of batting championship, sought many years by Joe Jackson, is likely to precipitate one of the hottest scraps in the American League dash for the top of the average list this year that Ban Johnson's or any other man's circuit ever saw.

Joe struggled along for years, cracking the leather on lots of baseballs and attaining dizzy batting heights, but Ty Cobb always was just good enough to pull out in the lead. Speaker came along, got set with a new club, and hit 'em so fast and often that Cobb was forced to look on from a rear seat while Jackson merely hooked on in third place.

Joe has issued his challenge for this year. He says the name once boasted by a President of the United States is going to be right at the top when Ban B. promulgates next summer's most important list in the lives of batters. Cobb, he says, may be second, or even Speaker may get that far, but he has served warning that Joe is going to ride the winning horse.

Noted Batting Honors.

Cobb also has made some passing remarks in which he intimated that there isn't going to be glory without a few sprints in the summer. He has set his eyes on that batting championship and wants it badly enough to stretch his legs hard for every blow.

Cobb, so one story has it, was a very much disappointed peach when the last season was over and the customary Cobb was lacking at the head of the American League averages. He had acquired such a Ben Adhem habit that it was hard to let go. He was grieved and somewhat astonished to observe that it wasn't Jackson who challenged him, but Speaker, main cog in a machine which shouldn't have placed him that high.

And just to keep competition from growing stagnant and carrying all interest to the younger league, the National League probably will fling a little dust around in staging its battle for the leadership.

Jake Daubert, long recognized as a king, didn't like it a bit when he was nosed out a year ago. He likes his hits perhaps better than any other star in the game, so he promises to give Hal Chase, Roger Hornsby, Lew McCarty and some other aspirants the climb of their young lives for John K. Tener's heaviest batting average. All around it should be a busy little season for the average fiend.

MASON HELD JOHNNY COULON TO HARD DRAW

Fort Wayne, Ind., March 30.—Frankie Mason, of Fort Wayne, and Johnny Coulon, of Chicago, former bantamweight champion, fought ten fast rounds to a draw here tonight.

Coulon had the advantage in the earlier stages, but Mason was stronger at the close and compelled the Chicago fighter to hang on repeatedly in the last two rounds.

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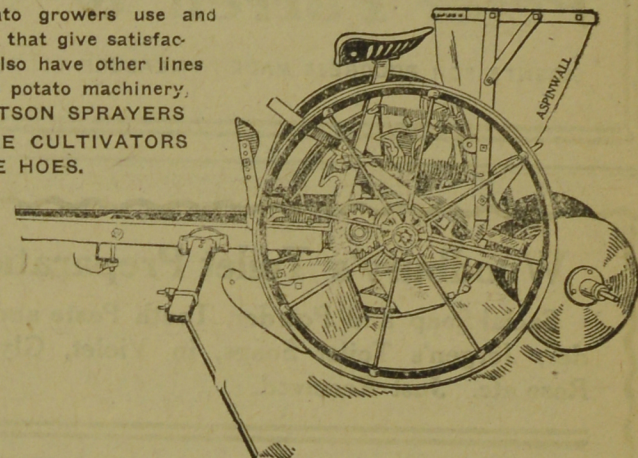
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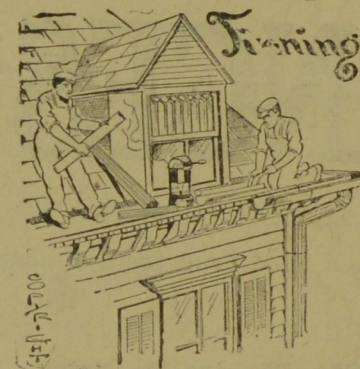
