THE SPRING PARSNIP.

Delicious When Boiled Till Tender, Then Baked with White Sauce.

The spring parsnip has a heart as woody as a bamboo stem, while the outside may be cooked soft in ten minutes.

To prepare parsnips for various final modes of cooking, boil or scald for from six to eight minutes. The skin may now be removed easily and the parsnip cut up lengthwise for deep fat frying, for baking in a gravy with meat, etc.

If to be baked in a white sauce, in which way they are agreeably modified in flavor, cut them into blocks and slice off the soft outer part. Make a plain white sauce rather thick, or prepare one with onion, as follows:

Slice or chop one medium onion and stew it gently for a few minutes in a tablespoonful of butter in the saucepan. Add a rather large tablespoon of flour and mix till smooth, then add one cup of milk and stir all the time over the fire until it thickens.

Pour this sauce over the sliced soft parts of four good sized parsnips, and bake in the oven 20 minutes, or cook for that time under the broiler, about six inches away from the fire. Bread crumbs or cracker crumbs may be mixed with this or sprinkled over, but with the sauce alone the dish is agreeably palatable.

Instead of slicing off the soft parts, these may be scraped off and the whole mashed. The mashed parsnip mixed with the yolks of two eggs, well beaten

and seasoned with salt and pepper, the stiffly beaten whites then folded into the whole, the mixture put into a buttered baking dish and baked for 10 minutes, will make a vegetable soufflé of pleasant flavor.

CHOCOLATE FUDGE.

Two cupfuls sugar, 2 oz. of unsweetened chocolate, 2 tablespoonfuls corn syrup, 1 cupful milk or water, 2 tablespoonfuls butter, 1 teaspoonful vanilla, 1 cupful chopped nuts. Boil together all the ingredients except vanilla and nuts, until when a spoonful is dropped into cold water it forms a soft ball that just keeps its shape. Remove from the fire, add vanilla and nuts and beat until creamy, then turn into a buttered pan, and when cool cut into squares.

VETERANS WILL RUN IN BOSTON MARATHON

Boston, April 16.—Winners of former Marathon runs will be conspicuous in the Boston A. A. classic on Thursday, with almost a dozen already entered. Among the entries are Arthur Roth, winner last year; Sidney Hatch, Mystic Club, Chicago; Frank Zuno, of Newark, N. J., who won the Brockton Marathon two years ago; Clarence H. DeMar, of Melrose, victor in 1911, and who held the record until Mike Ryan established the present figures; Hjalmar Dahlberg, Swedish-American A. C., Chicago; Mike Lynch, Carroll Institute, Washington, ninth in last year's race, and William Paakki and William Wick, both of Maynard. The total entry is now sixty.

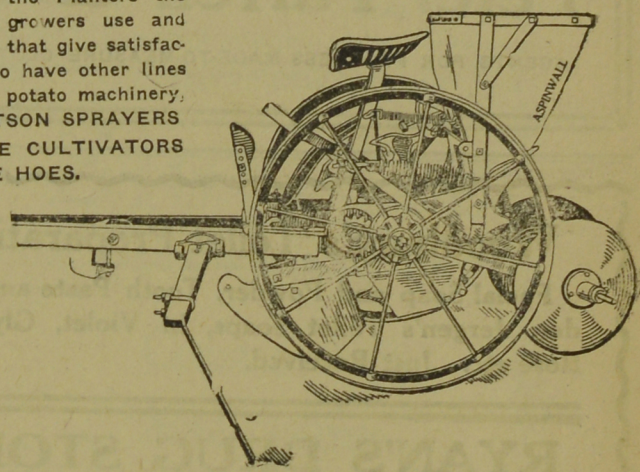
