
USE THE GRINDER.

Nowadays, when it is necessary to use every scrap of food, patriotism forbids any waste. Many a crust of bread has been thrown away simply because it was too much work to dry it and roll it into fine crumbs that later on might be used for croquettes.

But the vegetable grinder makes the work of crumbling dry bread exceedingly easy.
