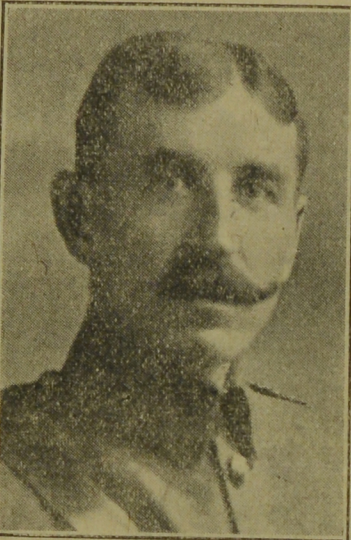

U. N. B. Senate Permits Him to Assist in Work of Food Control in New Brunswick.

The Senate of the University of New Brunswick at a special meeting held yesterday granted one year's leave of absence to Dr. W. C. Kierstead, professor of Philosophy and Political Economy. The leave began with the academic year which opened yesterday when examinations started.

To Assist Food Controller.

The leave is given in order to permit Dr. Kierstead to devote his time to assisting the Food Controller, Hon. W. J. Hanna. His appointment to assist in the important work of Hon. Mr. Hanna was made through Dr. J. W. Robertson of Ottawa, chairman of the Advisory Committee on Food Control. Dr. Robertson was in Fredericton and other places in New Brunswick recently and at that time secured the consent of Dr. Kierstead to take part in the work. It is understood that he will be employed in this province.

Successor on U.N.B. Faculty.

Dr. W. S. Carter, Chief Superintendent of Education, and Dr. C. C. Jones, Chancellor of the University of New Brunswick, are a standing committee of the university senate to secure

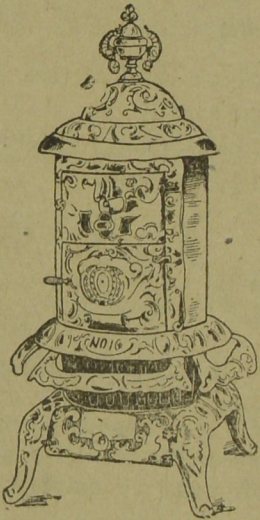
