## FREDERICTON MEN CANDIDATES IN ALBERTA

Gordon Jonah in Acadia and Frank P. Layton in Camrose—Former Residents of This City.

The Provincial elections in Alberta will take place on Thursday of next week. By a special act of the Legislature several candidates on both sides now serving overseas were legislated back to their seats. Soldiers have been granted the privilege of electing two members. The names of a number of former New Brunswickers appear in the list of candidates. Mr. Gordon Jonah, son of Mr. W. H. Jonah of this city, is running in Acadia as a Conservative. Mr. T. W. Tweedie, a Sackville man, and Rev. H. B. Hillocks are Conservative candidates in Calgary. Mr. Frank P. Layton, a Nova Scotian at one time a resident of this city where he was Y. M. C. A. secretary, is the Conservative candidate in Camrose. Mr. Hector L. Landry, son of the late Sir P. A. Landry of Dorchester, is the Conservative candidate in St. Albert. Mr. Nelson Spencer, formerly of Bloomfield Ridge, York county, and Mr. L. G. Turgeon, son of Mr. O. Turgeon, M. P., for Gloucester county, are among those overseas in the C. E. F., legislated back to their seats.

## THE PIPE BAND GOES TO BOSTON IN A FEW DAYS

236th Battalion Can Recruit Among British Subjects in United States—Medical Inspection.

The pipe band of the 236th Highland Battalion will leave for Boston, Mass., about the middle of next week and will remain in and about the Massachusetts city for some days. The band will be used in a recruiting campaign for the 236th among Canadians and other British subjects in New England. The band now has a strength of upwards of thirty pipers and drummers.

The recent announcement that a British commission to have charge of recruiting in the United States for British units had opened offices in New York is in line with the movement of the 236th Battalion to seek recruits there. The United States government has given its consent to the project. The campaign of the local unit in Boston will be of a private nature.
