### OF INTEREST TO WOMEN.

#### PRESERVE SOME PEARS.

##### Pear Honey.

Pare and cut the fruit in small pieces. To each pound of fruit allow the grated rind of one lemon. Add lemon rind to pears and cook quickly until water evaporates; then strain through sieve. To each quart of the pulp allow four cups of sugar and the juice of two lemons. Cook all together rapidly until thick, stirring frequently. Turn into glasses and seal.

##### Sweet Pickled Pears.

Pare three and one half pounds of hard Duchess pears. For this quantity make a syrup of two and one-half lbs. of sugar, one-half pint of vinegar and one-half cup of water. If vinegar is very sour, take more water and less vinegar. Add one-third of a cup of stick cinnamon, one tablespoonful of cloves and boil slowly for one-half hour. Press a couple of cloves in each

pear and cook in the syrup until tender. Put pears in jars, reduce the syrup and fill jars to overflowing. Adjust rubbers and covers.

##### Pear Chips.

To four pounds of pears allow two pounds of sugar, two ounces of ginger and two lemons. Pare firm pears, quarter, core and cut in small pieces. Add sugar and ginger to the pears and let stand overnight. In the morning add lemon juice and the grated rind of lemon and cook slowly for three hours. Turn into glasses and seal.

##### Canned Pears.

Pare the fruit, cut in halves and re-

move cores, retaining stems. Make a syrup of one cup of water, one and a half cups of sugar, and the juice of one lemon. Skim, add pears and cook until tender. Sterilize jars and covers, and with silver fork place the pears in jar. Fill jar to overflowing with hot syrup. Adjust rubber and cover and tighten securely at once. Bartlett pears are best for canning.

#### THE SEWING MACHINE.

Hemstitching can be very neatly done on the sewing machine in this way: Draw the number of threads desired and baste the edge of the hem in the centre of the drawn threads. Lengthen the stitch on the machine and stitch on the very edge of the hem. Pull the bastings out and pull the edge of the hem to the bottom of the drawn threads. Hemstitching done this way can scarcely be distinguished from that done by hand.

Another way to hemstitch when you wish to join two pieces of material is to fold several thicknesses of blotting paper together and lay one piece of material on one side and one piece on the other, with the folds of paper between.

Keep the edges perfectly even, and stitch through the material and paper, having a very long stitch on the machine. When the seam is sewed, pull out the paper, crease back the edges of the seam and stitch again on both edges, having the long threads of the

former stitching pulled apart the full width.

### VICTIM OF A TERRIBLE ERROR

New York, Sept. 25. — (Montreal Gazette) — That the inquest into his death on Thursday will show that Commander Henry Gunn, of the land battleship Recruit in Union Square, was the victim of a terrible mistake when he was practically beaten to death for alleged traitorous remarks at a recruiting rally in Brooklyn Saturday night, is the confident prediction of his fellow officers, many of whom have been intimately associated with him during his twenty-nine years of service in the navy.

Gunn, whose tragic death has cast a gloom over the Union Square battleship, died Sunday night in Holy Family Hospital, Brooklyn, where he was taken Saturday night when the police found him with his skull crushed, at Smith and Fulton streets, the victim of an attack by soldiers and civilians. Someone on the outskirts of the crowd which had assembled to watch the efforts of Company M, 23rd Infantry, to gather recruits, is said to have yelled: "To hell with the United States, the flag and the president; hurrah for the fatherland." The crowd picked Gunn as the man who had uttered the unpatriotic cry.

### These Men Will Help You Decide

Are you liable to be selected for service under the Military Service Act? The answer to this question is being made readily available for you. Remember that the first class to be called includes only men between the ages of 20 and 34, both inclusive, who are unmarried or widowers without children, those married after July 6, 1917, being deemed single for the purposes of the Act.

Medical Boards are now being established throughout Canada. These Boards will examine, free of charge and obligation, all men who wish to be examined as to their physical fitness for military service. They will tell you in a very short time whether your physical condition absolves you from the call or makes you liable for selection.

It is important that you obtain this information as soon as possible. A certificate of unfitness from a Medical Board will secure for you freedom from responsibility under the Military Service Act from any Exemption Tribunal. A certificate of fitness will not preclude an appeal for exemption on any ground.

In order that you may be able to plan your future with certainty, visit a Medical Board as soon as possible and find out if you are liable to be selected. Your family and your employer are interested as well as yourself.
