"BOCK" BEER NOT "BOCK."
Evidence was to Effect it is Made Locally—Interesting C. T. A. Case.

The case against Sam Campbell, charged with violating the Canada Temperance Act, was continued before Police Magistrate Limerich yesterday afternoon. Evidence for the defence was submitted which was to the effect that the so-called "bock" beer sold in the city is not "bock." A representative of the bottling company which supplied the defendant with beer was called as a witness and swore that beer in unlabelled bottles seized by the police at Campbell's place of business was weiss beer darkened artificially, and that bottles labelled "Porto" contained an aerated drink made locally and flavoured with a patent extract that made it taste like porter. Both were said to be non-intoxicating. The wine which was seized was sworn to be made three years ago from grapes bought locally with sugar added.

JOHN B HAWTHORN TAKES OVER DUTIES OF SHERIFF OF YORK

Will Perform Duties of Gavler and Reside in Apartments at Gaol--- Official Experienced and Appointment Popular

Mr. John B. Hawthorn, of McAdam, has been appointed High Sheriff of York county in the place of Mr. W. T. Howe, who retires on account of advancing age. The appointment is a most popular one, the new sheriff being well known in all parts of the county. Sheriff Hawthorn was in the city yesterday making arrangements for removal from McAdam to this city. He also took over the duties from the former sheriff.

Will Have No Deputy.
Sheriff Hawthorn will have no deputy, unlike his predecessors in office for many years past. He will personally perform the duties of keeper of the county jail and will reside there in the jailer's apartments.

Mr. John F. Timmins, who has been deputy to ex-Sheriff Howe for several years, is seriously ill at his apartments at the jail, not having recovered after a recent operation at the Victoria Hospital. On account of his illness Sheriff Hawthorn will not take up his residence there until June 1st.

Extensive Experience.
The new sheriff has had extensive experience in law enforcement and in the performance of official duties. He was deputy sheriff of York county for twenty-five years while Mr. A. A. Sterling held the office of sheriff. After that he was Chief of Police of Fredericton for several years. For the past five years he has been in police service

NINETEEN WILL BE GRADUATED BY U.N.B. ON MAY 17TH

Six Woman and Thirteen Men--- Fifteen in Arts and Four in Science ---Sir Ezekiel McLeod to Address Graduating Class.

The Encoenia of the University of New Brunswick will take place a fortnight from today, May 17th, when a class of nineteen will be graduated.

This class will be smaller than the average class for some years past, but larger than the classes will be for some years to come, as enlistment for service overseas has seriously reduced the registration of young men at the University.

There will be fifteen degrees in Arts, six to young women and nine to men. The four science degrees will be one in civil engineering, two in electrical engineering and one in forestry.

The encoenial programme will be as usual. Chancellor Jones announces it to be as follows:

Address in praise of Founders—Prof. J. W. Stiles.

Valedictory—Charles R. Smith.

Address to graduating class—Chief Justice Sir Ezekiel McLeod.

Alumni oration—Hon. J. D. Hazen, Minister of Marine and Fisheries.

Hon. Mr. Hazen was selected by the Associated Alumni as the orator and accepted. There is doubt, however, whether or not he will be in Canada at the time of the Encoenia.

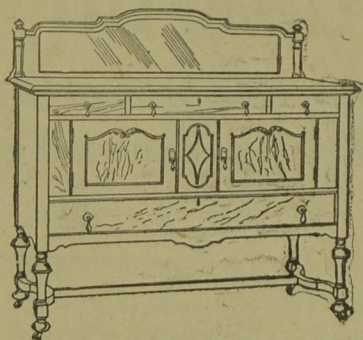

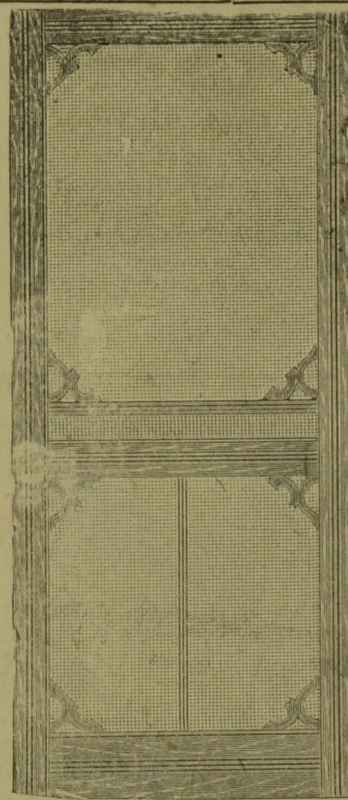
