CITY TREASURER PERKINS APPOINTED CITY CLERK

Will Act Until April 30th—City Solicitor Likely to be Engaged.

City Treasurer George R. Perkins was appointed City Clerk by the City Council in committee last night. His appointment will be confirmed at a council meeting held at a later date. The appointment is for the balance of the year, which will end April 30th, and the salary is \$350 per year. What action will be taken on the expiration of the year will be decided when the annual appointments are made.

Mr. Perkins has performed the bulk of the duties of City Clerk ever since the late J. W. McCready was taken ill about three years ago.

If it is necessary for legal aid to be secured for the preparation of bills to go before the Legislature, Mr. R. B. Hanson is to be employed.

It is possible that a city solicitor will be engaged. The Administration of Justice Committee has been empowered to negotiate with the barristers of the city with a view to engaging one in that capacity.

Mr. R. B. Hanson, who has acted for the Police Commission in prosecuting Canada Temperance Act cases, has relinquished the position and Mr. J. B. Dickson has taken up the duties.

To Legislate Against Pirates

Washington, Feb. 13.—A bill directed against ruthless submarine warfare and proposing to open the ports, and harbors and other waters of the United States in time of war to warships or vessels of belligerents against whom such warfare is waged, was introduced today by Senator Saulsbury, Delaware, president pro tem of the Senate, and a member of the foreign relations committee. At his request it was referred to the committee.

The bill is entitled "An Act to Discourage the Violation of International Law Upon the High Seas."

visers:
C. D. Richards, \$400 per year.
J. B. Dickson, \$500 per year, or \$15 per day.
G. T. Feeney, \$250 per year or \$15 per day.
R. B. Hanson, \$400 per year or \$20 per day.
Mr. Richards also offered to do the combined work of secretary-treasurer and county solicitor for \$1,400 per year.
Coun. Alex. Brewer, seconded by Coun. Everett, moved that Mrs. W. J. Glenn be confirmed in the appointment as secretary-treasurer for the balance of the year at the annual salary of \$1,200.

Coun. Stairs moved in amendment that the Council decide whether or not the duties performed heretofore by the secretary-treasurer were to be divided.

Coun. Douglass pointed out that the special auditor had said that he could not have performed the work without Mrs. Glenn's assistance and would not be able to complete the work without it.

Coun. T. W. Brewer claimed that the amendment was out of order as it did not affect the original motion.

Coun. Lawson spoke strongly in favor of retaining the services of Mrs. Glenn.

Coun. Pat Graham was opposed to separating the duties of the office. Mrs. Glenn was valuable and had rendered great service. He realized that, but it was necessary that there be a man as secretary-treasurer who could give legal advice at any time.

Coun. Sloat thought it would be a great mistake to turn down Mrs. Glenn. The councillors hardly realized what she had done for the county. Mr. Williams had said he could not have made the special audit in the time he did without her work. He was opposed to increasing taxation but he believed it would be better to retain Mrs. Glenn's services for the balance of the year, even at a slightly increased cost.

Coun. T. W. Brewer was of the same opinion.

Coun. Pickard believed that Mrs. Glenn should be retained. He also believed the amendment to be out of order.

Coun. H. A. Smith pointed out that Mrs. Glenn could be of great value in preparing an audit of the 1915 accounts. He would support the appointment of Mrs. Glenn at the salary of \$1,200.

Mrs. Glenn Appointed.

Coun. Allen was much in favor of appointing Mrs. Glenn at the salary named. Under the circumstances it would be well to divide the duties of the office.

The amendment was withdrawn. The names submitted for the county solicitorship were those of R. B. Hanson, C. D. Richards, J. B. Dickson and Gregory T. Feeney. The vote was taken by ballot and Mr. Feeney won out on the casting vote of Warden Neill. The first ballot stood: Feeney 14, Richards 13, and Hanson 3. Feeney and Richards tied on the second ballot and the Warden declared Feeney elected. His salary is to be \$250 per year.
