ITALIANS ARE
HOLDING WELL

Italian Army Headquarters, Nov. 21. (By the Associated Press)—The battle in the mountainous region in the north between the Piave and Brenta rivers, is nearing its culmination. It centres at Monte Greppa, and has become a struggle of giants.

It is now clear that, notwithstanding the great number of troops employed by the enemy and his advantages of terrain, he is able to advance only very slowly now that he is not being assisted by the element of surprise, by treason and other circumstances which favored him at first. Even if the Italians should be obliged to abandon the Piave river line they may be expected to fall back more slowly and offer still more tenacious opposition.
