## OTTAWA PLEASSED OVER WORK OF CANADIANS

Ottawa, Ont., April 10—The splendid performance of the Canadian troops in the capture of Vimy Ridge causes intense satisfaction at headquarters in Ottawa and felicitous cables went forward to general Sir Julian Byng, commander-in-chief of the Dominion's forces. That is such a momentous offensive, making what may well be the turning point of the war, Canadian troops should be assigned to the very forefront is regarded in its self as a signal honor and compliment to the steadiness and efficiency. How the work maintained the magnificent record at St. Julien and elsewhere is told in the cable despatches which give more detail than the brief messages, which have come here. What divisions and brigades took part is not yet known. It is assumed that a victory so remarkable as this has not been accomplished without some resultant losses, but the intimation that they are slight is particularly gratifying.

European War Veterans' Association  
Reorganized Last Night—Calgary  
Constitution Adopted—George  
W. Betts New President.

The Fredericton Branch of the European War Veterans' Association met last night and reorganized. It also was decided that a memorial service would be held at Christchurch Cathedral on the morning of Sunday, April 22nd. This will be in memory of comrades who will never return from Flanders and France, and also in commemoration of the fighting near Ypres in April 1915, in which the Canadians took part. Rev. eDan Neales will arrange for special music at this service.

The meeting last night was held in the Sons of England Hall and was very largely attended. The officers of the 236th Battalion were well represented and practically all the returned men in the ranks of the battalion and those resident in Fredericton were present.

It also was decided that on the night of Saturday, April 21st, the Association will give an entertainment in the City Opera House. The concert troupe of the 236th Battalion will assist.

### DR. D. E. WHEELER

HAS APPOINTMENT  
FROM WAR OFFICE

American Sportsman Who Fought With  
French Foreign Legion is Now in  
London—Is Well Known in  
This Vicinity.

Dr. David E. Wheeler, of Buffalo, N. Y., who with Mrs. Wheeler spent some weeks in Fredericton and vicinity during the early part of the winter, is now in England, having received an important appointment from the British War Office. The doctor served in France with the Foreign Legion, and was severely wounded in the big drive at Champagne. Upon recovering his health he made a trip to the Peace River Country and afterwards spent two months in the Miramichi woods with Guide Henry Braithwaite, of this city. He left here in January, going to Ottawa, where he tried to secure an appointment as medical officer with the Canadians for overseas service. His efforts were unsuccessful and he was preparing to return to New Brunswick, when he received a summons to report for duty at the British War Office. He took passage by the first steamer and was accompanied by Mrs. Wheeler. "If he goes to the front, I go," Mrs. Wheeler told a friend before leaving Fredericton. She has already served with the American Ambulance Association in France, and was under fire more than once. She is probably now engaged in hospital work in the old country.

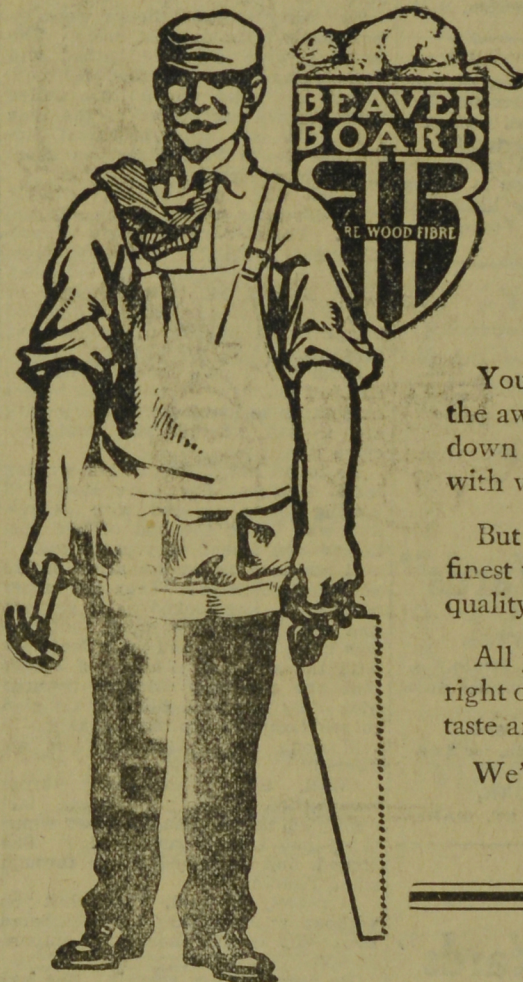
