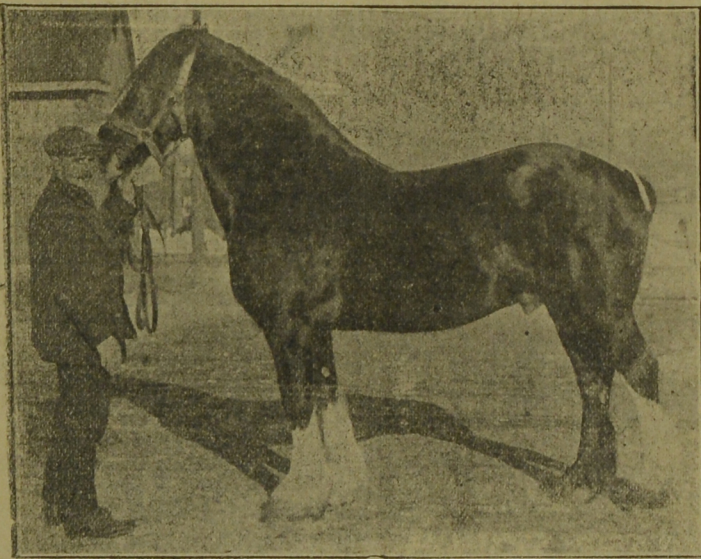

RIDGEMARK, RANK OUTSIDER, THE SURPRISE

Trainer Drove Him to Win \$3,000 Ohio Stake at North Randall Track on the Grand Circuit.

Cleveland, O., July 18. — Ridgemark was the big surprise in a day of surprises at the North Randall Grand Circuit meeting today, when Trainer piloted the bay son of Wilask to the front and captured the \$3,000 Ohio stake, the feature of the card.

Ridgemark, a rank outsider, in the betting, paid the best price in the mutuels so far, those backing him to win getting \$141.80 and the place price being \$39.90.

Ruth Mainstreet captured the Forest City sweepstakes, Tommy Murphy handling the reins in each instance.

Mack Forbes captured the 2.12 trot in straight heats, beating the favorite Chilcoat in rather easy fashion. Colleen, the favorite in the 2.05 pace, was a poor third, Walter Cochato, an old timer, winning handily. Edward P. captured the 2.12 pace, Battle King, the favorite, finishing third.

The judges were dissatisfied with the driving of Colleen in the 2.05 pace and declared off all wagers in the final heat and the race.

FAVORITES MADE POOR SHOWING

Worcester, Mass., July 17. — Worcester's Bay State Circuit meeting opened today with excellent running and fast time. But one favorite, Forrest B., in the 2.23 trot, won. Wheeler Gentry, after winning two heats easily in the 2.20 pacing stake, tired after the third heat and Rhoda Ashbourne won the event, which went six heats.

Lady Amis was the class in the 2.24 pace, leading her field from behind in the first two heats and leading the bunch the full distance in the third. Forrest B. laid considerably over the field in the trotting event.

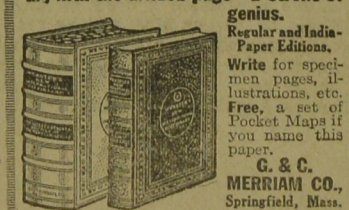

BAN JOHNSON EXONERATES J. F. BAKER

Highlanders' Third Baseman Able to Prove He Had Not Tried to Get Sothoron to Jump.

New York, July 17. — The Senators, sixth place club in the American League, supply the tragedy of the season on their record to date.

Possessed of one pitcher generally referred to as the king of them all, and holding a generally fair array of other ball players, the Senators have scored more runs than any team in the league. Cleveland is below the Senators in the matter of club fielding but easily top them in games won.

The answer probably lies in ineffectiveness of Washington pitchers. Walter Johnson is having the poorest year he ever experienced. Victories simply cannot go his way. And it isn't a case totally of poor support, for he has been given some decidedly rough pastings, having been driven from the box a time or two.

Johnson nestles far down in the list of pitchers, something he isn't accustomed to. Shaw, Harper and Gallia of the Washington staff, all top him in the average column, and Shaw and Gallia have appeared in only four less games than Johnson. A sudden tightening of Clark Griffith's pitching staff in view of the figures, would give the rest of the American League quite a surprise party.


JOHNSON IS MUCH BELOW PAR
